MESSAGE FROM MAYOR GLENN SINGER Regarding Flooding Season in Golden Beach

Dear Residents,

It is important for us all to be aware that during the autumn months tidewaters in South Florida are the highest of the year. As September winds to a close the waters have already begun to rise. November 5^{th} is projected as the highest tide of the year, often referred to as the "King Tide."

During high tides, you may see pooling in our streets as waters rise through storm drains. The Town's storm water system will help alleviate much of these issues. Since these waters originate from the ocean, they can contain corrosive salt deposits and other contaminants. Avoid driving through standing water if it is possible to do so without causing a danger to yourself or others.

Please understand that with severe rainstorms, combined with high tides, our pumps may become inundated and water may back-up temporarily. This is issue will resolve as conditions improve and pumps are allowed to catch up.

Hurricane Irma left a wake of downed trees and branches; help keep our drains running smoothly by being sure to leave any storm debris that you would like collected two feet away from the curb. This will help prevent leaves, branches and other waste from washing into the street and clogging drains.
