The motion passed.

The Town Manager made a budget presentation, giving historical information on the balancing of the last fiscal year's budget, and how that is affecting the balancing of the coming fiscal budget. The Town Manager also took some time out to explain the TRIM notice residents received, pertaining to Golden Beach's millage rate. The Manager explained that there are some assumptions the budget makes, such as not budgeting for increases for the employees, accepting the proposed FOP contract and the anticipation of an additional \$100,000 in code violations for the coming year. The Manager briefly spoke about the Fund Balance and how it has grown over the last four

years, and also spoke briefly about the Town's indebtedness. The resources available for landscaping have been increased. There have been liability increases such as the Town's water and utility bills, and the price of gas. The proposed combined millage rate is 8.50 mills. Town Manager mentioned that residents could go to the Town's website, at www.goldenbeach.us, and download the excel sheet to calculate would their taxes would be.

Councilman Einstein inquired about the homesteaded properties. The Town Manager explained that the homesteaded properties in Town increased in their assessed values.

The Mayor went over the budget book section by section with the Town Manager explaining what the differences in the 2011-2012 and the 2010/2011 fiscal year budgets are. One topic the Town Manager talked upon was an increase in amenities at the beach pavilion for the upcoming fiscal year, without affecting the budget numbers.

The Town Manager also gave an overview of the Town's Capital budget, going over each of the projects.
