#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Town Council adopt the attached Resolution No. 2442.16 as presented.

#### Request:

It is requested the Town authorize the use of LETF monies to make a contribution to Teach for America (TFA) in the amount of \$5,000 to recruit, select, train and provide ongoing support to corps members in Miami-Dade County.

#### **Background:**

TFA is an organization that recruits recent college graduates of all background's to teach for two years in urban and rural public schools. TFA trains and develops these corps members so that they have an immediate positive impact on their students who are usually attending under performing schools in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties.

The quality of our public education system in South Florida is vital to the regions ability to actively recruit and retain corporations and residents, and thrive as a leading region for economic and social prosperity. The use of LETF Funds for this type of function and purpose is appropriate and at the core of combating delinquency that often leads to egregious criminal acts.

Since 1990, nearly 33,000 leaders have joined TFA to help move the organization closer to a shared vision that one day, all children in this nation will have the opportunity to attain an excellent education. TFA teachers have reached more than 3 million students across 43 urban and rural communities, founded dozens of high-performing schools, boldly led school districts and charter management organizations, and helped pass groundbreaking education legislation. It would be in the best interest of the Town to use LETF monies to support this organization.

#### **Financial Impact**:

\$5,000.00 from the Town's Law Enforcement Trust Fund.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE USE OF LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUST FUND (LETF) MONIES TO MAKE A \$5,000 CONTRIBUTION TO TEACH FOR AMERICA (TFA); PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town desires to make a \$5,000 contribution to Teach for America (TFA) to recruit, select, train, and provide ongoing support to corps members in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties; and

WHEREAS, TFA is an organization that recruits committed recent college graduates of all backgrounds to teach for two years in urban and rural public schools; and

WHEREAS, the Town's LETF account includes assets forfeited to the Town by authority of the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act and by the Federal Asset Forfeiture Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council desires to utilize LETF funds to pay for this contribution; and

WHEREAS, the monies contained in the LETF are the result of seized assets from both investigations by the Town's Police Department and joint investigations with other law enforcement agencies – not from tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended that the \$5,000 cost be taken from the Town's LETF for "other law enforcement purposes" specifically authorized by law; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police certifies that this expenditure complies with § 932.7055, Florida Statutes, and / or the Federal Seizure statutes in that the funds will be used for an appropriate law enforcement purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police certifies that the Town's LETF is not being used as a normal source of revenue for the Town Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police certifies that the Town's LETF was not considered in the adoption and approval of the Police Department budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council finds that it is in the best interest of the Town to proceed as indicated in this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. Recitals Adopted.** That each of the above-stated recitals is hereby adopted and confirmed.

Section 2. \$5,000 Contribution to TFA is Authorized. That the contribution of \$5,000 to TFA and the use of LETF funds to make the contribution are hereby authorized and approved.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Implementation.</u> That the Mayor and Town Manager are authorized to take any and all action which is necessary to implement this Resolution.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> That this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

## Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Town Council adopt the attached Resolution No. 2443.16 as presented.

## **Background and History:**

The Town of Golden Beach Police Department is requesting the purchase of a suitable police canine for patrol work with the ability to be cross-trained as a Narcotics detector canine. The Chief of Police is requesting the approval of the Town of Golden Beach Council in order to proceed with the request to purchase.

The Golden Beach Police Department will use the City of Miami K-9 Training Bureau for training the handler and dog (at no cost). Additionally, the Golden Beach Police Department will purchase the K-9 from one of the Town's' approved canine vendors, and will outfit a police patrol vehicle to a Canine police vehicle. This will also include all necessary canine equipment.

## **Financial Impact:**

Canine and related equipment is \$17,550.00.

#### **Background and History:**

The Golden Beach Police Department has requested the approval from the Town's Council to continue to lease two police motorcycles.

### **Financial Impact:**

The lease agreement with Chester's Harley-Davidson of Fort Lauderdale, is for two police Harley Davidson model FLHTP motorcycles. The lease term is for thirty-six (36) months and will be billed monthly. The total amount per motorcycle each month is \$589.05, which includes all maintenance with the exception of clutch replacement and physical damages.



YOU UNDERSTAND THAT LESSOR IS NOT OFFERING ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES WITH RESPECT TO THE VEHICLE, IN PARTICULAR, LESSOR MAKES NO IMPLIED WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY AND THERE IS NO WARRANTY THAT THE VEHICLE WILL BE FIT FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.

- 18. RISK OF LOSS. You will have the risk of loss of the Vehicle only when You take possession of it (except as provided in Item 24 when a Vehicle is stolen, and not recovered, or destroyed
- 19. MAINTELIANCE, REPAIRS, AND OPERATING EXPENSES. You agree to maintain and repair the Vehicle to keep it in good working order and condition. You agree to pay for or cover all maintenance repair and operating expenses. You also agree to service the Vehicle as the manufacturer recommends in the Owner's Manual and Maintenance Schedules folder that comes with the Vehicle and as the manufacturer requests in any recall campalgo. All such replacement parts, mechanisms and devices shall be free and clear of all liens, encumbrances and rights of others, and shall become the property of Lessor and shall be covered by this Lease to the same extent as the Vehicle originally covered by this Lease. Lessor shall not be liable or responsible to Lessee for any loss, damage, liability or expense of any kind caused by or related to the Vehicle, or resulting from any detect in or deficiency of the Vehicle, or resulting from the use or operation
- 20. EXCESS WEAR. "Excess wear" includes: (a) glass that is damaged or that You have tinled; (b) damaged body, fenders, metal work, lights, trim or paint; (c) missing equipment that was in the Vehicle when delivered and has not been replaced with equipment of equal quality and design; (d) missing tools; (e) missing or unsafe wheels or tires; (f) any tire with less than 1/8 inch of tread remaining at the shallowest point; (g) torn, damaged or stained seats; (h) any mechanical damage or other condition that causes the Vehicle to operate in a noisy, rough, improper, unsafe, or unlawful manner; and (i) any other damage, whether or not covered by insurance.
- 21. FINES, LIENS, AND ENCUMBRANCES. You agree to keep the Vehicle free of all fines, liens. and encumbrances. If You do not promptly pay any fines or remove any liens or necumbrances, Lessor may do so. You will owe Lessor any amounts Lessor pays to do so. You will also owe Lessor \$20 for each time Lessor pays a fine Imposed on the Vehicle during this Lease.
- 22. SCHEDULED TERMINATION. This Lease is scheduled to end one month after the last payment is due, unless You and Lessor agree to extend this Lease. If You and Lessor extend this Lease, the scheduled end will be the date upon which You and Lessor agree in writing.
- 23. NOIMPPROPRIATION. You are obligated only to pay such Lease Payments under each Lease as may lawfully be made from funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose. Should you fall to budget, appropriate or otherwise make available funds to pay Lease Payments under any Lease within the Original Term, such Lease or Leases shall be deemed terminated. You agree to deliver notice to Lessor of such termination at least 15 days prior to the end of the last budgeted month. Failure to give such notice shall not extend the term beyond any month which payment has not been received by the Lessor. If any Lease is terminated in accordance with this Section, Lessee agrees to peaceably deliver the Vehicle to Lessor at the location(s) to be specified by Lessor. Additionally, You agree to pay all charges required by Item 24 of this Lease.
- 24. VOLUNTARY EARLY TERMINATION AND RETURN OF THE VEHICLE. You may terminate this Lease early, if You are not in default, by returning the Vehicle to Lessor and paying the following: (a) an early termination fee of \$200, plus (b) the difference, if any, between the Unpaid Adjusted Capitalized Cost and the Vehicle's Fair Market Wholesale Value, plus (c) all other amounts then due under this Lease. You will never pay more than the sum of the remaining unpaid lease payments, plus any excess wear charges, and all other amounts then due under this Lease.

HOWEVER, if the Vehicle is stolen (and not recovered) or destroyed and Lessor receives an insurance settlement, You will owe Lessor the amount of the insurance deductible instead of the

Definition Of Excess Wear Charge: The cost of any repairs needed because of excess wear as explained in paragraph 20.

Unpaid Adjusted Capitalized Cost is reduced on each payment due date. It is calculated by reducing the Adjusted Capitalized Cost each month by the difference between the Base Monthly Payment and the part of the Rent Charges earned in that month on an actuarial basis. Rent Charges are earned when due. Lessor will provide You with a written explanation of the actuarial method upon Your request

Fair Market Wholesale Value, at Your option, will be: (a) an amount agreed to by You and the Lesson or (b) the value which could be realized at the wholesale sale of the Vehicle, as determined by a professional appraisal obtained by You at Your expense within 10 days from termination from an independent third party agreeable to Lessor, or (c) if not established by agreement or appraisal, the net amount received by Lessor HDL upon the sale of the Vehicle at wholesale.

- If You are in default, Lessor may terminate this Lease. The amount You owe upon termination will be determined under Item 24.
- If You are in default, Lessor will have the remedies in this Lease, Lessor will also have any other remedies applicable law gives Lessor except as Lessor otherwise agrees in this Lease. Lessor's rights include the right to sue You for damages and to recover the Vehicle and the right to take the Vehicle from You without demand. Lessor will exercise its rights and remedies without breach of the peace, at reasonable times and places, in a reasonable manner, and in accordance with applicable law. If You are in default and if the law permits, You agree that Lessor or its agents may enter Your property, or the property where the Vehicle is stored, to take the Vehicle if they do not breach the peace or break the taw. If any personal property is in the Vehicle when taken, Lessor can take the property and store it for You. Any property attached to the Vehicle will stay with the Vehicle.
