The meeting was called to order by the President Pro-tem, Mr. N. B. Ornitz who acted as Chairman of this Meeting and Mrs. Laurita Chapman acted as Secretary.

The President Pro-Tem, Mr. N. B. Ornitz stated that the purpose of this recessed meeting was to elect a President of the Town Council and to present appointments as Commissioners of various departments of the Town to the Members of the Council. He therefore asked that nominations be made for President of the Council. Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett moved the election of Mr. N. B. Ornitz as President of the Council, which motion was seconded by Councillman Mr. Edward M. Stuart and when no further nominations were offered, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the nominations were closed and Mr. N. B. Ornitz, was declared President of the Town Council.

The President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, stated that nominations are now in order for appointments of Commissioners in charge of the respective branches of the Town's Government, namely:-

1. Commissioner of Law And Finance. Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart moved the appointment of Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings which motion was seconded by Councilman Mr. F. W. Roth. No other nominations being made the nominations were closed and it was unanimously approved that Councilman Mr.

- 2. Commissioner of Police And Fire. Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings moved the appointment of Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, which motion was seconded by Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett. No further nominations being made, the nominations were closed and it was unanimously approved that Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart be appointed as Commissioner of Police And Fire.
- 3. Commissioner of Parks & Public Buildings. Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett moved the appointment of Councilman Mr. F. Waldo Roth, which motion was seconded by Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings. No further nominations being made, the nominations were closed and it was unanimously approved that Councilman Mr. F. Waldo Roth be appointed as Commissioner of Parks And Public Buildings.
- 4. Commissioner of Public Streets and Lighting. Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett stated that Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz has done such a wonderful job as head of this Department that he remain as is, therefore he would like to make a motion to this effect. This motion was seconded by Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings and when no further nominations were offered, the nominations were closed and it was unanimously approved that Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz be appointed as Commissioner of Public Streets and Lighting.
- 5. Commissioner of Health And Sanitation. Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings moved the appointment of Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, which motion was seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart. No further nominations being made, the nominations were closed and it was unanimously approved that Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, be appointed as Commissioner of Health And Sanitation.

The appointment of a Town Attorney was then presented. Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett recommended that Mr. Francis M. Miller be appointed and retained as Town Attorney, as he has served the Town faithfully for thirty years. This recommendation had the full approval of the Members of the Council and Mr. Francis M. Miller was appointed as Town Attorney. The Town Attorney, Mr. Francis M. Miller, thanked the Members of the Council for their confidence in his ability and stated that it has always been a pleasure for him to be associated with the Members of the Council.

The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, stated that the duties of a full time employee to act as Town Manager is not needed at the present time, but that the Mayor, Mr. Earry O. Turner has consented to act in this capacity. There has been a rumor going around in the Town that the former Town Manager is going to be recalled which is absolutely false. He would like it understood by all that Mr. R. H. Kuiken, the former Chief Of Police and Town Manager, will not be re-hired by the present Town Council. He would also like it known that an investigation is still going on with regards to the aauthor-shipp of some "poison pen" letters that were sent out during the recent election campaign and when this fact is determined, there will be justifiable cause for suit against the writer. Since the Mayor. Mr. Earry O. Turner, has consented to assume the duties of Town

Manager, he would like to have the Council's approval on this appointment. Whereupon the Secretary was requested to call the roll on this matter as follows:

Thereupon it was unanimously agreed that the Mayor, Mr. Larry O. Turner be appointed as Town Manager.

It was further agreed that Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz continue to assume the duties of Building Inspector of the Town until the services of a competent person could be engaged for this purpose.

The Mayor, Mr. Larry O. Turner, stated that as Mayor and Town Manager he would like to appoint Mr. Charles M. Hilgert as Superintendent of Maintenance. Mr. Hilgert who is known to most people as "Little Charlie" repairs and maintainsce all the equipment of the Town, also expedites the collection of garbage and trash, the cleaning of the beach and many other chores and is always willing to cooperate with the Council's every wish. The Mayor, Mr. Larry O. Turner, further stated that he would like to retain Mrs. Marjorie Mayor as temporary Town Clerk until further notice.

The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, stated that it has been customary for the outgoing Council to return their Commissioner's badges, but it was his opinion that these men be allowed to keep these badges as a token of the Town's appreciation for their services. He asks the Council's approval on this matter, which was unanimously granted, therefore the Secretary was instructed to purchase new badges for the newly appointed Commissioners and newly elected Mayor. The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, further stated that a word of thanks be given to former Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough for having an aluminum basket built for the Town, as indeed this was a wonderful improvement and a very fine gesture on his part.

The Commissioner of Police And Fire, Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart reported that his department is doing a very fine job in safeguarding the welfare of the people of the Town and in view of this fact and because several promotions were to and have been made, a revisal in their scale of pay should be made. He therefore recommended the following:

Chief Charles A. Crum who was promoted from Lieutentant receive \$400.00 per month, effective January 15th, 1959 when he was appointed

Patrolman James W. Bryant be promoted to Lieutentant and is to as Acting Chief

receive \$360.00 per month, effective March 1st, 1959. Patrolman Donald R. Gwynn, who has been a member of the Police Force for over three years is to receive \$350.00 per month effective

Patrolmen, John S. Riley and William DeMattia are to receive \$280.00 offective March 1st, 1959, with salary increases of \$20.00 every March 1st, 1959.

These recommendations had the full approval of the Members of the Council and the Secretary was instructed to carry out same.

The Commissioner of Law And Finance, Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings, stated that since he has not had time to make a thorough study of the financial condition of the Town, nor its legal functions, he was not prepared to present any matters of business at this meeting.

The Commissioner of Parks And Public Buildings, Councilman Mr. F. Waldo Roth, reported that he too has not had time to make a study of his department and its functions, however he would like to suggest that the Residents of the Town form a committee, which committee would present to him their suggestions and complaints in regards to the operation of his department as this would greatly assist him in carrying out his duties as Commissioner of Parks and greatly assist him in carrying out his duties as Commissioner of Parks and Public Buildings. A Resident, Mr. Ralph E. Hough, who was former Councilman and Commissioner of this department stated that such a suggestion was very good and if he can help in any way, Mr. Roth should feel free to call on him.

A Resident, Mr. E.S. Delia, stated that he was very much in favor of the recommendations presented by the Commissioner of Police And Fire, Councilman Mr. E. M. Stuart, as to the salaries to be paid to the members of the Police Department. He cited on the good work done by the police department in safeguarding the welfare of the Residents and that they are entitled to this extra compensation for their wonderful services.

A Resident and former Mayor, Mr. Burt Hengeveld, inquired if lights are to be installed on the beach. He stated that the former Town Manager had started such work which was not satisfactory to all the Residents, but it was his opinion, in light of recent attempted burgarlies, that some type of lighting system should be installed, and he asked that the Members of the Council give this matter some consideration. The Members of the Council advised Mr. Hengeveld that this matter would be given every consideration and that after a thorough study is made, some action will be taken.

A Resident, Mr. J. W. Goldthorpe, stated that he wished to thank the Members of the Council for their very fine work on behalf of the Town and that he was very happy that the majority of the people of the Town had confidence in them.

A Resident, Mr. R. E. Bernson, stated that he was very happy too that there is going to be no change in the Town's administration, but he was wondering if the speed limit on Ocean Boulevard could be reduced. The Commissioner of Police And Fire, Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart reported that considerable work has been done in this regard and called on former Commissioner Of Police and Fire, Mr. Anthony J. Gocking, who was present at this meeting as a Visitor to give a report on this Matter. Mr. Anthony J. Gocking, stated that a letter of complaint had been sent to the State Road Department in Tallahassee, that a second check of the traffic on this road had been made by engineers from their a second check of the traffic on this road had been made by engineers from their department and the results were that 40 miles an hour was a safe speed rate. However, there may be other ways and means to have this speed rate reduced, which matter is being worked on at the present time.

The Commissioner of Health and Sanitation, Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, reported that on his way to this meeting in the Town Hall, he had stopped off at the Loggia and the beach looked so clean and beautiful, the ocean so serene that he would like to suggest that this meeting be adjourned as soon as possible so that the Residents present could take advantage of such a glorious delight.

Mrs.S. Lewis, a Resident, stated that she experienced considerable difficulty in getting in and out of her driveway located on the west side of Ocean Boulevard and she personally would appreciate anything that could be done to lessen the speed of traffic on this road. She also inquried why the street lights become dim and sometimes go out during a heavy rain. The Council President, Mr. N.B. Ornitz, advised Mrs. Lewis there is one circuit, the cable being underground, and when the soil becomes very damp it causes a short, but that an endeavor is now being made to get additional circuits with the Florida Power and Light Company which would greatly improve this condition.

A property Owner, Mrs. Schlossberg, stated that approximately three years ago she purchased a fifty foot lot on the west side of Ocean Boulevard with the intent that her daughter would be moving here from the North and build a home on same. Since then her daughter was forced to change such plans and when she tried to dispose of this lot she found it almost impossible to do so because of the Town's present building requirements and she asked if the Council could give her any assistance in this matter. The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, advised Mrs. Schlossberg that letters could be sent to the owners of the properties adjoining hers advising them that this lot is available and that any further information regarding this matter could be secured from the Town Attorney, Mr. Francis M. Miller, after this meeting is adjourned.

Mr. P. C.Riley, Resident, stated that he would like to suggest that in order to decrease the speed on Ocean Boulevard some of the 40 mile speed signs be removed. Lots of the motorists using Ocean Boulevard know that it was a 30 mile speed zone strictly enforced but because so many signs are on view, they have a tendency to go the limit of 40 miles. He also stated that a truck goes through Golden Beach on Ocean Boulevard every morning between 1:45 and 2:00 A.M. and the noise is so great that it is most disturbing and he asked if something could not be done to lessen this noise. The Members of the Council advised Mr. Riley that his suggestion as to the removal of the 40 mile speed signs would be given every consideration and the Chief Of Police will be instructed to look into the matter of the noisy vehicle.

A Resident, Colonel S. W. Winfree, stated that he was very happy over the results of the recent election, that in his opinion the Town appeared in excellent shape and he hopes that the New Council will have every success during their reign in office.

Mr. Burt Hengeveld, A Resident, inquired if notices are to be sent

to the Residents of the Town informing them of the results of the recent election. The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz advised Mr. Hengeveld, that due to the rush of work imposed on the Secretary, the sending of these notices has been a little delayed but that they have been prepared and will in no doubt be put in the mail today.

There being no further business to come before the Members of the Council at this meeting, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, the meeting adjourned.
