Members of the Town Council Golden Beach, Florida

Gentlemen:

We are submitting for your approval the enclosed set of drawings for the proposed William E. Naue residence to be built on Lot 19 and North 1/2 of Lot 20, Block D, Section A, Golden Beach.

A preliminary layout has already been submitted to Mr. Kuiken for tentative approval and Section 5 - Lot Line Restrictions was brought to our attention. It was suggested that the property owner to the North be contacted in order to gain his permission to build the Naue house approximately 14 feet east of a diagonal line drawn from his southeast corner to the northeast corner of the closest house to the south. The northeast corner of the Naue house would be 17 feet east of a perpendicular from the southeast corner of the residence to the north and 8.78 feet west of a perpendicular line drawn from the northeast corner of the house to the south.

Unfortunately, the two-story residence to the north was built quite sometime ago before the ordinance Section 5 was in effect. This house is only 48 feet deep and if Section 5 is strictly held to at this time in this particular situation, it would make Mr. Naue's lot almost impossible to build on due to the small amount of remaining property within the restriction lines even though he is 8.78 feet back of the house to the South, which is also in violation of Section 5 of the new zoning ordinance.

We, of course, are desirous of receiving approval of this variance in setback restrictions due to the above as soon as possible since Mr. Naue would like to occupy the house early this winter. Should the Town Council not see fit to grant this approval, we then would like to have an appointment set up at the earliest possible date with the Board of Appeals requesting this variance.

Our office has been fortunate in designing some outstanding homes in your lovely Village, and we take a personal interest in Golden Beach and its development. The Naue residence as it is now laid out will be a beautiful home and one that we feel sure you will be pleased to have built in your community. We fail to see how the proposed placement of the Naue residence will either spoil the view or stop the Ocean breeze from the house to the north unless the height of the wall and heavy foliage now existing is modified considerably.

We would appreciate hearing from you at your earliest convenience so that the architectural work may be completed and construction started as soon as possible.
