MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA

OCTOBER 24, 1959

A Special Meeting of the Town Council of the Town Of Golden Beach, Florida, was held on Saturday, October 24th, 1959 at 9:30 o'clock in the morning at the Town Hall. Upon roll call the following members were found to be present, constituting a quorum of the members of the Council.

Mayor Council President Councilmen

-Mr. Larry O. Turner -Mr. N. B. Ornitz

-Mr. Joseph R. Missett

-Mr. F. Waldo Roth -Mr. Edward M. Stuart

Councilman Mr. Philip H. Cummings being out of Town was not able to be present at this meeting.

The Meeting was called to order by the President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, who acted as Chairman of this meeting and Mrs. Laurita Chapman acted as Secretary.

The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, stated that the purpose of this Special Meeting was to vote on the adoption of a Resolution concerning the borrowing of money to meet the payment of the third bridge in the amount of \$21,812.00 which payment is due November 1st, 1959. He called upon the Secretary to read the Minutes of the recessed Special Meeting held on October 10th, 1959, which Minutes covered the action taken by the Mayor and Town Manager, Mr. Larry O. Turner and Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett in the negotiation of such loan. Upon the reading of these Minutes, when no corrections or suggestions were offered, were ordered approved by the Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz.

The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, thereupon called upon Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, who presented Resolution No. 85, which he read entitled: "A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FIORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF THE SUM OF \$21,812.00 FROM THE BANK OF HOLLYWOOD, HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, AND PLEDGING THE FULL FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF." Upon the reading of this Resolution by Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart questioned the method of paying this indebtedness as termed in this Resolution. Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett replied that the Town Attorney, Mr. Francis M. Miller, had been contacted in this regard and the advice received from him was that all Municipalities in making such loans use the term "FULL FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE TOWN", to meet their obligations, regardless of the source of the income, whether it is to be paid from ad-valorem taxes, bond issue or other means. When no further comments were made a motion to adopt this Resolution was made by Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, which was seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart and upon a voiced vote by roll call was unanimously carried, thereupon Resolution No. 85 was declared adopted by the Council

Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, stated that although this Note in the amount of \$21,812.00, states that payment is to be made on or before Two Years from date of issuance, the Bank in question is reluctant to make such loan for this length of time; that such loans are usually made for One Year afterwhich it can be renewed for another year if not paid and he asked the Council's permission to make such change if necessary since the interest received from this bank was most favorable, being hig. Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart stated that splendid work was done in this negotiation to get such interest rate and he wished to commend the parties responsible for same. Thereupon it was agreed unanimously by all the Members of the Council that when this loan is made an attempt should be made to get it for a two year term and if this could not be done, Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett and the Mayor and Town Manager, Mr. Larry O. Turner. are hereby authorized to change the Two Year period to One Year. Since this money is to be needed very shortly, the Mayor, Mr. Larry O. Turner requested that the necessary papers be executed immediately, which request was granted.

The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, stated that although the Council had adopted a budget for the year November 1st, 1959 thru October 31st. 1960, a slight change will have to be made and he called upon the Mayor and Town Manager, Mr. Larry O. Turner, who explained that when this budget was adopted this past May, an estimated amount in the budget receipts was proposed for lot cleaning. This amount was increased due to the fact that owners of odd shaped lots were assessed a higher fee for this service. Also revenue from taxes was to be increased due to certain homes being sold, thus losing their homestead exemptions. Since these proposed changes increases the amount of estimated revenue, the Auditors have added in the Budgeted Expenditure Appropriations, an item entitled "Reserve For Contingencies" in the amount of \$1,853.81 to make a balanced budget. However the amount appropriated for Insurance in this budget is not sufficient to meet the needs of the Town as when this budget was adopted insurance rates had not increased, but since a higher rate is now prevailing, plus the fact that the Town is now paying insurance coverage for its employees, he suggested that \$1,000 be added to the present figure of \$3.320.00 making the appropriation for insurance \$4.320.00 and decreasing the amount appropriated for Reserve For Contingencies from \$1.853.81 to \$853.81. The Council President, Mr. N. B. Ornitz, stated that the Mayor and Town Manager, Mr. Larry O. Turner, had spent considerable time working with the Auditors on this budget, also he had the Auditors prepare a simplified form of bookkeeping which will greatly aid the Deputy Town Clerk in the performance of her duties. The Mayor and Town Manager, Mr. Larry O. Turner had done a wonderful job in this regard and the Auditors have been most cooperative. Thereupon a motion was made by Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart and upon a voiced vote by rell call was unanimously carried that the proposed estimate of budget as presented by the Mayor and Town Manager, Mr. Larry O. Turner, be adopted, a copy of which is attached to these Minutes.

There being no further business to come before the Members of the Council at this meeting, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett, seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, the meeting adjourned.

Dear Mr. Landefeld:

In reply to your letter as to the authority of the Town to borrow \$22.500.00 for the payment of a bridge heretofore erected in Golden Beach, I advise you as follows:

Section 33 of the Charter of the Town of Golden Beach, being Chapter 14066 Special Acts of 1929, approved May 23, 1929, reads in part as follows:

"Section 33. The Town of Golden Beach, by ordinance or resolution of its Town Council, may issue from time to time revenue bonds or notes of the town, bearing interest at not more than eight per cent per annum and maturing not more than one year from their date, for the purpose of providing funds in anticipation of taxes theretofore levied.---".

The bridge is of concrete construction and has been completed for some time. The payment for this bridge has been approved by the Town Council, and taxes will be levied to pay the sum of \$22,500.00, being the total cost of the bridge. This is the amount Golden Beach would wish to borrow from the Bank of Hollywood. The certificate of indebtedness or note would run for a period of probably one year as the note will be paid out of current taxes or the Town Council may decide to pay the obligation and for additional public improvements by a bond issue.

You would need a proper resolution from the Town Council, requesting that this loan be made. The resolution

would state in part that the note is to be paid out of the funds in anticipation of taxes heretofore levied, and the full faith and credit of the Town of Golden Beach will be pledged to the payment of this loan.

As soon as I am instructed by Mayor Turner to do so. I will prepare all necessary papers so that this matter may be consummated.
