

RESOLUTION 425-88

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF GOLDEN BEACH AFFIRMING
AND ADOPTING PROCEDURES FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE
COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING PROCESS

WHEREAS, on January 23, 1988, the Local Planning Agency adopted
procedures for obtaining maximum public participation, and

WHEREAS, said procedures included submitting a Town Planning Survey
questionnaire to all residents of Golden Beach to obtain their input and partic-
ipation in the planning process, and

WHEREAS, over 20% of the Town's residents responded to said ques-
tionnaire, and

WHEREAS, said questionnaire included notice of pending public hear-
ings in compliance with Florida State Statute Chapter 163, and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has advertised public hearings before the
Local Planning Agency and the Town Council in the local newspaper in accordance
with F.S. Chapter 163 and has noticed every resident by mail,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. That the Town Council affirms and adopts the process for
public participation set forth above.

Section 2. That the Town Council is satisfied that said process
resulted in maximum public participation in the Comprehensive Planning process.

Section 3. That the Town Manager is authorized to transmit a copy
of this resolution to the Florida Department of Community Affairs with the Com-
prehensive Plan.

| 2. Prepare questionnaire pamphlet to mail to all with major items included in E.A.R. and proposed new objectives. | Will achieve maximum public thorough review. | Cost = Several hundred dollars. |
| 3. Prepare series of sub-committee meetings with citizens. Present results to L.P.A.* | Will receive limited thorough review. | Minimal printing, staff and consultant's time. |
| 4. Hold public workshop breakfast meetings with prominent residential and business leaders. | Input is limited, but valuable to staff and L.P.A. | Cost = \$100 per meeting, (\$5/per person), plus staff and consultant and graphic presentation. |
| 5. After initial public input, hold series of workshops with L.P.A. and publish results. 4 meetings (2 elements/meeting). Invite a citizens group to attend. | Limited public input, but L.P.A. receives valuable comments. | Cost is minimum, but L.P.A. time is maximum. |
