

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN
OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA

January 16th, 1962

The regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town Of Golden Beach, Florida, was held on Tuesday, January 16th, 1962 at 9:30 o'clock in the morning at the Town Hall. Upon roll call the following members were found to be present constituting all of the Members of the Council.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, who acted as Chairman of this Meeting and Mrs. Laurita Chapman acted as Secretary.

The President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, stated that all of the Members of the Council have received copies of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Town Council held on December 19th, 1961 and he called upon the Council Members to voice their opinions of same and if they wished these Minutes read. No comments being offered, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough, seconded by Councilman Mr. A. Brill and unanimously carried, it was agreed that the reading of these Minutes be waived and accepted as is.

The President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, further stated that a cash report from the Deputy Town Clerk for the month of December, 1961 had also been sent to all the Members of the Council and he asked if there were any corrections, objections or amendments to be made. No comments being offered, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, seconded by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough and unanimously carried, it was agreed that this Cash Report be accepted as received and attached to the aforementioned Minutes and made a part thereof.

The President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, called upon the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos to report on the appointments to be made by him for creating two committees, one to make a study of a Civilian Defense Program for the Town and the other to study the feasibility of having a sewer system installed. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, stated that such appointments are ready to be announced and called upon the Secretary to present such appointments as follows:-

Upon the presentation of these Appointments, a motion was made by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough, seconded by Councilman Mr. A. Brill, and unanimously carried that such appointments are hereby approved. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, explained that it is the duty of the Chairman of each Committee to call the meetings of his committee after which a report of any action taken by them is to be presented to the Council for approval; that all the Members of the two committees have consented to accept their respective appointments and will be advised of their duties in this regard.

The Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, called upon the Commissioner of Public Streets & Lighting, Councilman Mr. A. Brill to report on the problem that is confronting a Resident, Mr. Oscar Lieberman with regards to water remaining in front of his house after a heavy rain at 600 North Island. Councilman Mr. A. Brill reported that he contacted Mr. Lieberman and discussed this matter after which Mr. Lieberman realized that this condition was not due to any negligence on behalf of the Town, therefore this matter was resolved satisfactorily.

The Commissioner of Parks & Public Buildings, Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough, reported that the recent rains are very good for the new plantings throughout the Town; that the improvements to be done to the public buildings and parks are nearly completed.

The Commissioner of Health & Sanitation, Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, reported that his department is operating very efficiently except for the cleaning of the beach which operation has been hindered due to unfavorable tides and weather conditions. However, continued efforts will be made to keep the beach as clean as possible whenever conditions exist that this work can be done.

The Commissioner of Police & Fire, Councilman Mr. Charles C. Koch, reported that Patrolman George Z. Byrum was called to active duty with the United States Army on January 14th, 1962, thus causing him to leave the Police Department, which leave is regrettable as he was a fine Patrolman. However, a replacement has been found and the newly engaged patrolman has come with excellent references and is willing to accept this position on a probable temporary basis depending on the length of time ex-patrolman George Byrum has to serve with the United States Army.

The Commissioner of Public Streets & Lighting, Councilman Mr. A. Brill, reported that although the previous Council did an excellent job installing drains throughout the Town, some of the Residents would like additional drains installed, particularly in front of their Residences. Since such work would not be practical for the Town to undertake, as the drains already installed were to take care of areas not individual dwellings, it was agreed that no action be taken on this matter at the present time.

The Town Manager, Mr. Charles Crum, reported that although money has been appropriated in the current budget for the purchase of a new mower for the vacant lots, the old one was able to be repaired and is now in good operative condition thus causing a savings to the Town for such expenditure. However the small edger is completely useless and must be replaced. The welding equipment is still in working condition and it is hopeful that it will be usable until the end of this fiscal year.

The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, reported that he has three problems on his agenda:-

1. Requests from numerous charitable organizations for permission to solicit in our Town. So Many requests have been received in this regard and since our Residents dislike being bothered, almost daily, by persons unknown to them, seeking donations for various causes, he ask that the Council Members pass a Resolution prohibiting such solicitations unless it is conducted by a bona-fide Resident of our Town. The Council Members, after discussing this matter, decided for the safety of our Residents, that such a Resolution should be considered and called upon the Town Attorney, Mr. Francis M. Miller, who presented Resolution No. 94, which Resolution, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough, seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart and unanimously carried was passed and adopted as follows:-

RESOLUTION NO. 94

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH REGULATING THE SOLICITING FOR CHARITY AND OTHER PURPOSES BY PERSONS OTHER THAN RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:

No person shall be permitted to solicit for charity or for any other purpose among the residents of the Town Of Golden Beach, or to solicit from house to house for such purpose, unless such solicitor shall be a resident of the Town Of Golden Beach and shall have first secured a permit for such solicitation signed by the Mayor of the Town Of Golden Beach.

This Resolution is passed as an emergency measure for the reason that persons unknown to the police and residents of the Town Of Golden Beach have been soliciting from house to house, and it is passed as a police measure in order to protect the residents and people of the Town from being exposed to solicitors who may go about from house to house in order to obtain information concerning the premises which may be used for unlawful purposes.

The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, stated that his second problem is that in making a survey of damaged seawalls for some of our Residents, it was discovered that certain portion of walls owned by the Town have likewise become defective and if they are not repaired in the very near future, the cost will be excessive. Since no money is appropriated in the current budget for such expenditure and only One Firm has submitted an analysis of their findings, he would like to suggest that the Town Manager, Mr. Charles A. Crum contact other Firms with the request that they likewise submit an analysis of their findings and if it can be determined from the reports received that the repairs to the Town's seawalls will not have to be done immediately, then an appropriation for such expenditure will have to be made in next year's budget, but if it is determined that this repair work is of an emergency nature and must be done immediately, then arrangements will have to be made to have such funds available for the cost of same.

The third problem presented by the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, is our present method of taxation which to him appears rather awkward. We now have a tax for real estate, then a fee for lot cleaning, beach cleaning and garbage collection and after giving this matter considerable thought, it was his opinion that if all these charges were assumed in one over-all tax, it would be a much better and simple method of taxation. The thought may occur that this method may not be justifiable to certain taxpayers as they will be paying for certain services which they do not receive, however taking into consideration the different charges placed against all the properties in the Town, it will almost equal itself out in the over-all picture. He ask the Members of the Council to give this matter considerable thought and suggest they offer their opinions of same at future Council Meetings.

There being no further business to come before the Members of the Council at this Meeting, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough, seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, the meeting adjourned.

Approximately eight months ago our neighbors
along ALA just south of us felt that they would desire to have
a sanitary sewer system installed to run from our southern
boundary south to Hallover Beach where it would flow into a
disposal plant. The expense of the building, maintenance of the
sewer system and disposal plant would be borne by the Models and
Stores on ALA from Golden Beach to Hallover Beach.

When this was presented to Metro, Metro would
not give approval of this project unless the sewer system would
be large enough to service all areas north of this proposed
development within Dade County and the only area north is Golden
Beach.

It was the opinion of a number of our citizens
that when this development took place the time would be ripe for
Golden Beach to go into a sewer system program and connect with
the above project. Not any of us has any knowledge of the cost
nor do we know if the majority of our residents have a great
desire to change from our present septic tank to a sewer system.

Gentlemen:

Your note of January 19th, 1962, has been turned over to the Chairman of our Civilian Defense Committee, Mr. Charles C. Koch, who will handle all future correspondence relative to fallout shelters but since time is of the essence I am taking the liberty of answering your inquiry regarding the availability of buildings in our Community.

The Town Of Golden Beach has a charter requirement which prohibits the building on any property other than that of a one-family residence and the only building that we have available that would meet with your requirements is our Town Hall. This is a two-story building, well built in a substantial manner with a capacity for fifty people and I believe would potentially be suitable as a fallout shelter. We would be pleased if you would visit us and inspect our premises and you may accept this letter as an invitation.

Our only other asset is that the Town owns some vacant property, which I think could be made available, if the need arises, for fallout shelters to be placed on them.

Rest assured that we will be most willing to cooperate with you at all times on this matter.

Dear Mr. Crum:

This is to advise you that the Corps of Engineers has officially authorized my office to proceed with the National Fallout Shelter Survey. The area assigned to me includes the entire Town of Golden Beach.

This survey is divided up into a number of phases requiring each phase to be completed before the next phase can be started. Phase 1-A must be completed before February 15 in order to meet the time schedule set up for the complete survey.


Since time is of the essence and since this program is a Defense Department and Civil Defense joint project, I would appreciate as much cooperation from the various City Departments that is obtainable.

Our report to the Corps of Engineers for Phase 1-A requires us to submit a list of buildings three stories or more in height or buildings of heavy construction that would potentially be suitable as fallout shelters. We also have to submit a map of the city showing the location of all potential fallout shelters.

For the purpose of this survey, a fallout shelter must have a capacity for fifty or more people and must have a minimum protection factor of twenty without additional compensating construction. Altho we estimate that buildings three stories or more in height will meet these requirements, it is understood that certain smaller buildings of substantial concrete construction or with basements, may also meet these requirements.

Since Phase 1-A includes making preparations for Phase 1-B, we will also need the name and address of the owners of each building and the name and address of the Manager of each building. Any assistance you can give us in obtaining this information will be appreciated.

Nearly every Community in the United States has
some type of Civilian Defense Program and Golden Beach faces an
even greater danger than most communities due to its proximity
to the Ocean, therefore a Civilian Defense Program must be
developed with great rapidity. The Federal Government is rapidly
allocating funds to both Counties and Municipalities throughout
the Country for the purpose of building fallout shelters to
equalize areas and having the necessary medical and first aid
equipment on hand for the protection and welfare of the people
in the event of an all-out war.

Those of us who have been placed in public office
undertake certain responsibilities but the responsibility which
you face by serving on this Committee is by far, much greater
than that of any other Committee because your prime duty will be
that of protecting the health, safety and welfare of our people
if an when such emergencies arise, and I, for one, sincerely
hope that the time does not occur when we will have to call on
you.

If there should be a need for your services, we
must be prepared, therefore, I urgently suggest the following:-

1. An Auxiliary Police and Fire Department be developed to see that we have adequate shelter protection and/or a proper method of evacuation.
2. The assemblage of medical and first aid equipment and the development of some of our Citizens so they can be expert in rendering first aid assistance.
3. To contact local, State and Federal Departments to find out what other equipment may be needed for further safety precautions.

Please realize that your duties are much more important than that of any elected official of our Town and if you think that you will not be able to assume the responsibilities placed upon you in accepting this appointment, do not hesitate to let me know so that a replacement can be made. You were chosen by our Council because it was their opinion that you were well qualified and can be depended upon to do this work.
