Douglass, st AlA is such the hazardous traffic conditions that exist on State Road AlA between the southern boundary of Golden Beach and Sunny Isles Boulevard or 163rd Street. He cited that since the County widen the road and made it a four-lane highway with a parkway in the center practically every motel along this highway has a road crossing over it; that he had counted fifty-eight paved crossroads, excluding the unpaved, which allows motorists to cut in front of the heavy traffic moving north and south. Since the Residents of Golden Beach pay considerable sums of money in taxes to Dade County, they should be given some consideration in this regard and he therefore would like the Members of the Council to ask for some relief of this problem from the Dade County Commissioners in order that the Residents of Golden Beach who have to travel south can do so in safety.
