REGULATING THE TYING-UP OR DOCKING OF BOATS "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 40 ULATING THE TYING-UP OR DOCKING OF BOATS IN THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH BY ADDING SECTION 5, WHICH SAID SECTION SHALL READ AS FOLLOWS:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:

No poles or mooring piling or anchor floats shall be permitted to remain in the waterways of the Town Of Golden Beach in front of any property unless the owner of such property shall continuously use said poles or mooring piling or anchor from such lot line. No anchor floats shall be used in the mooring of any boats unless the placing of the same shall have been first approved by the Town Manager. No poles or mooring piling or anchor floats shall he marriated to the flown Manager. poles or mooring piling and anchor floats; upon the failure to do so, upon notice by the Town Manager such owner shall be subject to the fine and penalties provided in Section 3 of Ordinance No. 40" floats for the docking of boats owned or controlled by such owner, and upon disposing of said boat or boats, it shall be the duty of the owner to remove poles or mooring piling and anchor floats; upon the failure to do so, upon Beach and signed by the Town Manager. In going over the expenditures to date in the current budget, there is s strong indication that a surplus will be on hand at the end of our fiscal year of between \$22,000 and \$25,000, providing that no unusual occurrences take place such as hurricane damage, etc., therefore, he would like to suggest that this surplus be used to recall the outstanding flown Of Golden Beach Municipal Improvement Sea Wall Bonds in the amount of \$6,660.00 which will reduce the flown's Deficit and save interest payments in the coming years.
- 2. The facilities of an ambulance are very badly needed in our Town, thereform would like to suggest that the Council consider purchasing a station wagon for the Police Department in lieu of a new Police Car, which station wagon could be such emergencies arise. have our usual number of the Police Department in lieu of a new Police Car, which station wagon could be outfitted as an ambulance and still be usable as a squad car, thus we would still two squad cars, one could be used as an ambulance when
- is more hours than other Police Departments in other communities are working, by having this extra patrolman, the Town Manager has worked out a very good schedule whereby during the season the Police Department will work \$\text{l8}\$ hours a week and during the off-season, \$\text{l0}\$ hours, thus for the whole year they will average working \$\text{l1}\$ hours a week, which can easily be accomplished with the extra patrolman without reducing the services of the Police Department. The additional expense to the Town would be that of the extra patrolman's salary and cost of stationed at this site without hindering the Police Department from performing their other duties while they are directing traffic, thus one man will be on hand to take care of traffic and the other to perform the duties required of the Police Department. 3.
