

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN  
OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA

APRIL 18th, 1961

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The Regular Meeting of the Town Council of the Town Of Golden Beach, Florida, was held on Tuesday, April 18th, 1961 at 9:30 o'clock in the morning at the Town Hall. Upon roll call the following members were found to be present constituting a quorum of the Members of the Council.

Councilman Mr. A. Brill, being out of Town was not able to be present at this meeting.

The following Residents attended the Meeting as Visitors:-

Mr. James H. Ruby, and Mr. Milton Sirkin were also present on behalf of the Citizens Committee of Miami Beach, Florida.

The Meeting was called to order by the Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, who acted as Chairman of this Meeting and Mrs. Laurita Chapman acted as Secretary.

The President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, stated that since all the Members of the Council have received copies of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Town Council held on March 21st, 1961, he asked the Members of the Council if they wished these Minutes read, corrected or amended. No corrections or amendments being offered, it was agreed upon motion by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, seconded by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough that the reading of these Minutes be waived and accepted as received.

The Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, stated that an attempt is being made to form a separate county out of Dade County and in this behalf, Two Visitors were present and he called upon the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos to give the introductions, he being in charge of all Public Relations of the Town. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, stated that at the request of certain Miami Beach City Officials that the Town Of Golden Beach consider joining their City along with other local communities in an endeavor to have a new and separate County formed out of Dade County and in this regard he had invited Mr. James H. Ruby and Mr.

Milton Sirkln so that the Members of the Council and the Townspeople can have a thorough knowledge of the plans and benefits to be derived from such a measure. Mr. James H. Ruby, who took the floor, explained that he and Mr. Sirkln are here representing the Citizens Committee of Miami Beach, which Committee's most ardent desire is to form a separate county apart from Dade County and in this endeavor, a bill is to be presented to the State Legislature during its present session now being held in Tallahassee. The plan for this new County is to take in the entire area from the Broward County Line south to the Government Cut and from the Inland Waterway east to the Atlantic Ocean. Nearly all of the Municipalities located in this area have already adopted Resolutions stating that they are in favor of having such a new County formed and he asked the Members of the Town Council of the Town Of Golden Beach, Florida to consider passing such a Resolution at their Meeting being held today. Mr. Ruby further pointed out that the main reason for this action is that at the present time Metro Dade County is receiving from this area \$21,000,000 in taxes from which few benefits are received and by forming a new County, this money will be made available for use by the new County only, which is to be named Miami Beach County and will be expended for improvements to attract more tourists to this area, this being the main source of income and by more tourists visiting this area, the whole State of Florida will benefit as people travelling by cars must make certain expenditures on the State Roads. Since Golden Beach is not interested in tourist activities, the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, questioned what benefits Golden Beach can expect to receive by joining such a merger. Mr. Ruby replied that the present school system would be improved as the new County would maintain and control their own schools; also the main highway, which is Ocean Boulevard, through the Town Of Golden Beach, will be maintained and improved by the new County; Golden Beach bearing this expense at the present time. When the question arose if this proposed new county does materialize, Golden Beach, becoming part of it, will an attempt be made to take over its municipal powers similar to what Metro Dade County has been trying to do, Mr. Ruby stated that definitely no such attempts will be made, that the proposed new County will operate like the former Dade County before Metro came to power. With regards to hospitals, Mr. Ruby stated that eventually the proposed new county plans to have adequate and proper hospital facilities available for all its residents. At the request of the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, that some of the Residents of Golden Beach voice their opinions on this matter, Mr. James T. Hennegan, Resident, stated he was opposed to Metro and he was not in favor of this as they always promise a lot but give nothing. Mr. George Draper, Resident, stated that since the Town will receive something, whereas now they are receiving nothing, he was in favor of this measure. Mr. Louis Abrons, stated that he was against joining Miami Beach as Golden Beach has nothing in common with this City and the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, replied that Golden Beach has nothing in common with any City, however it might help the Town and its people if they desegregated from Metro Dade County as some benefits might be forthcoming to everyone's welfare from the proposed new County; also he would like to escape from the evils of Metro as in his past experience, it always cost the public more for certain services that they had to use when a metro form of government took power. A general discussion followed with the visiting audience participating, Dr. D. B. Shulman, suggesting that the Town postpone taking any action on this matter awaiting the outcome of this Bill when it is presented to the State Legislature. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, explained to Dr. Shulman that the Council's action at this time does not have any bearing on the outcome of the presentation of this Bill, but to encourage having it presented

and when it was noted that if such bill is presented and passed, the final decision will be put up to the registered voters residing in the area of the proposed new County as this Bill provides that a referendum must be held before this proposed new County can be formed, a motion was made by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, seconded by Councilman Mr. Charles C. Koch and upon a voiced vote by roll call unanimously carried that the following Resolution be passed and adopted namely:-

"RESOLUTION NO. 93

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH  
REQUESTING THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF  
FLORIDA TO FORM A SEPARATE COUNTY OUT OF  
DADE COUNTY, WHICH COUNTY SHALL COMPRISE  
THE GREATER MIAMI BEACH AREA

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That it is self-evident that the creation of a new county comprising the Greater Miami Beach area and including the Town Of Golden Beach will be for the best interest of the people of the State of Florida and the Greater Miami Beach area and will better enable the people of the area to govern themselves and will permit them to improve and enhance this entire area for the entertainment and recreation of the millions of visitors to this area.

Sec. 2. That the Town Of Golden Beach does hereby join with the other communities in this area in requesting the members of the Legislature of the State of Florida to give to us this much needed relief by creating a new county for us.

Sec. 3. That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to each member of the Legislature and the Governor of the State Of Florida.

Mr. Ruby pointed out that all expenses incurred in connection with the passage of this bill is being undertaken by the Citizens Committee of Miami Beach; no Municipality is expected or will be requested to contribute to this cause. He with Mr. Sirkln thanked the Members of the Town Council of the Town Of Golden Beach, Florida, for their action on this issue and for their being allowed to be present at this Meeting, afterwhich they left the Meeting.

The Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, called upon the Members of the Council to present any unfinished business, upon which the Town Manager, Mr. Charl A. Crum reported that complaints are still being received about the construction

of a wall in front of a residence on the Ocean. The Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, explained that a certain Resident erected a seawall in front of his property at 365 Ocean Boulevard, using material that would be considered debris and that complaints have been received on the erection of this seawall due to the fact that if a storm arises, the debris from this wall could cause considerable damage to other properties. The Owner of the property in question has been contacted in this regard and although an endeavor has been made to make it storm-proof, it is still not completely sound and most unattractive in appearance and the question now is what further steps can be taken to have this wall obliterated or replaced so that it would be safe and attractive. It was noted that the Town does not have an Ordinance governing this matter; also it was reported that the Owner of this property is endeavoring to have this wall made sound, thereupon the Council President Mr. Joseph R. Missett, instructed the Town Manager, Mr. Charles A. Crum, to apprise the complainants that the Owner in question is within his rights in having such a wall erected on his property.

The Town Attorney, Mr. Francis M. Miller, stated that since Metro Dade County has taken over all traffic courts within its jurisdiction, the Town Of Golden Beach does not have a law compelling persons to pay for damages to Town property arising from an automobile collision. In this regard, Ordinance No. 92 has been prepared which he read entitled "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, FOR THE PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY IN THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE." This Ordinance being of an emergency measure was given its first, second and third readings at this meeting and upon the readings of this Ordinance a roll call was taken as follows:-

Councilman Mr. Joseph R. Missett - aye

Thereupon the Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, declared Ordinance No. 92 adopted.

The Commissioner Of Police & Fire, Councilman Mr. Charles C. Koch, reported that he has his budget appropriations covering his Department for the coming fiscal year prepared except for salaries, which he plans to have ready within the next few days.

The Commissioner of Parks & Public Buildings, Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough submitted an itemized list of budget appropriations for his departments, which the Council proceeded to review in detail. It was unanimously agreed that a new garbage and trash pick-up truck should be purchased in evidence of the recent demonstration of such a new truck; its operation proved that considerable man-power hours, cost of maintenance, etc. can be reduced, to do such work around the Town. Also the Council will consider, the purchase of other equipment as set forth in this list, the improvements to the Loggia, the old Police Station and extra labor as suggested by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough.

The Commissioner of Health & Sanitation, Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, reported that he has prepared a tentative budget appropriation for his departments totalling \$16,000, which provides for the cost of garbage and trash disposal, mosquito control, beach cleaning, maintenance and depreciation of equipment used in such work.

The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, suggested that informal meetings be held with the Town Manager, Mr. Charles Crum, at a time when all the Commissioners could be present to discuss the needs that will be required for the operations of the various departments for the coming year, and when a decision has been reached on this matter, the Townspeople should be notified by mail of what is anticipated for the proposed new budget so that they can offer their comments on same, before such budget is adopted by the Council. This suggestion met with the full approval of the Council Members.

A Resident, Mr. Bob Bernson, questioned the new assessed valuations that is to go into effect this year, placed against all properties in the area governed by Metro Dade County. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, replied that it was his opinion that the assessed valuations of all property in the Town Of Golden Beach will probably be doubled, however he was in favor of such action as people who must liquidate their estate can have same done in a fair manner. Mr. Bernson also questioned if people who own a truck or similar vehicle are allowed to park same on their property and the Mayor, Mr. Berkos, replied that this comes under "Peoples Rights", would cannot be denied.

The Secretary read a letter from Mr. Herbert F. Matthewson, requesting that he be allowed to construct a home on 100 x 150 feet, property that he owns in the Town, with 1800 squarefeet of livable floor area space and a two-car garage. Since the Ordinances of the Town Of Golden Beach, calls for a minimum of 2500 squarefeet of livable floor area space for all homes that are erected in the Town, this request was denied and the Secretary was instructed to advise Mr. Matthewson of the Council's decision on this matter.

It was agreed unanimously by all the Members of the Council that the first informal meeting to discuss appropriations for the new proposed budget, be held on Friday, April 28th, 1961 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening at the Town Hall.

There being no further business to come before the Members of the Council at this Meeting, upon motion by Councilman Mr. Ralph E. Hough, seconded by Councilman Mr. Edward M. Stuart, the meeting adjourned.

The undersigned Councilman begs to submit his estimate of cost necessary to maintain and improve the various departments entrusted to him as follows:--

1. Purchase of new equipment that will modernize and eventually save its cost by eliminating manpower, truck travel, costly repairs to present equipment. The equipment necessary for this operation is

- (a) One Garbage and Trash pick-up truck  
approximate cost - - - - - \$8,800.00
  - (b) Side Delivery Rake For Beach work  
Present rake about eight years old  
and is worn out.  
approximate cost of new rake - \$ 525.00
  - (c) New Mower for fields - present machine  
is six years old and badly worn  
approximate cost of new mower - - \$ 685.00
  - (d) Lawn mower for parkways, parks and  
smaller places bought in 1957 and is  
badly worn. New machine which will be a  
36" compared to the present 24" machine  
will save labor and repairs  
approximate cost - - - - - \$ 595.00
2. Repairs to Loggia Roof and Buildings in General  
Cost of repairs to Loggia Roof - - - \$ 960.00  
Cost of repairs to Cabana Storage - - \$ 600.00

3. One man to work steadily in park end of setup to maintain a better looking main ALA parkway, also ends of each island, the Loggia and old or original headquarters of Golden Beach - the Atlantic Coastal Waterway on Centre Island. Repairs necessary here to put walls in shape, painting, landscaping, etc.,  
Cost approximately - - - - - \$1,500.00

4. Garage - I would like to recommend that an additional man, a Helper, be put on in shop to be used to help Charlie to do necessary follow-up in field when required rather than have Charlie chasing all over Golden Beach when shop work is at a standstill. Also investigate thoroughly whether we spend more in repairing ourselves versus having jobs done outside.

This additional man would be ready at any time to take over in case of sickness, quits, etc., besides getting work out of shop faster, stopping delays such as has been mentioned lately

Approximate cost of additional man - - - - - \$3,800.00


5. FERTILIZER - Purchase necessary fertilizer to maintain the plantings and grass throughout the Town

6. Replacement of canvas covers at Loggia with aluminum type awnings that would be hurricane proof and long lasting as compared to present canvas covering which requires constant repairs and renewing every Two years and eliminating a part time unsightly mess. Aluminum covering would also afford better coverage.
- Approximate cost of aluminum awning - - - - - \$1,348.00

7. Replace playground equipment - estimated cost - - - \$ 500.00

It is my opinion that the Town should do all possible to maintain a well landscaped Ala and the Parks as well as the Island at turn-arounds, etc. To this end we must have manpower, equipment, such as Lawn mowers, edgers, fertilizer, water, etc.

We must have the cooperation from all the property owners to help maintain the good-looking Golden Beach we are striving for.


Properly edged lawns against the roadways in front of our property will help greatly.
