Mr. Joseph N. Shure, Resident, questioned why no contingency appropriation was made and the Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, advised Mr. Shure that such appropriation was made which in his opinion would be sufficient to meet the needs of the Town.
Mr. Anthony J. Jocking, Resident, stated that the budget as prepared by the Council should be adopted. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, reported that it is his desire that the policy of having the Residents informed of what the Council plans to do with regards to the amount of taxes that are to be levied in order to meet the operating costs of the Town will be continued, this being the first year that such practice was put into effect, as it was his opinion that everyone should be aware of what their tax money is being used for, so that if anyone has any justifible objections, the Council has ample time to give same their consideration and make such adjustments to the proposed new budget as they seem fit, before its final adoption. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, further pointed out that the Deficit Appropriation of \$1,000 has no bearing whatsoever, on the administration of the former Council as they did a wonderful job during their tenure of office, but this deficit was created because the amounts anticipated to be received from Mr. Ralph E. Hough and Councilman Mr. Charles C. Koch undertook the expense of printing of the letter containing the proposed new budget recently sent out to the Residents of the Town, for which heartfelt thanks is hereby extended. The Mayor, Mr. Nicholas Berkos, further stated that all the Members of the Council should be congradulated on the excellent job they have been doing in curtailing expenses in their departments and for the many hours of work they put in in the preparation of this proposed new budget. The question arose as to why no beem eliminated from this proposed new budget, but an appropriation for such item will be made in the future budgets. The Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett from the end of its fiscal year which is September 30th to November 1st, when taxes are due, as during such period no receipts are forthcoming, yet operating costs must be maintained. The Council President, Mr. Joseph R. Missett, explained that in the Public Works Division, 90% of the equipment is obsolete and must be replaced, thus the appropriations for this department are higher than in previous years, however a depreciation policy is to be instituted which will create a reserve for the purchase of new equipment when it is needed so that the Mr. Nicholas Berkos explained that because the taxpayers, this year, are under-taking the cost of the new equipment needed, it was his opinion that they should not also be burden with the expense of its depreciation, therefore this item has appropriation for depreciation of equipment was made in this budget and budget goes into effect. The Maintenance Department has been able to reduce its crew by One Laborer and the cost of disposing of the Town's debris has been lessened since this new truck has been in use, thus creating a savings to the Town. The new playground equipment recently installed was financed by Councilman taxpayers in the future will not be burden with such expenditures.
