To the Town Council, Town of Golden Beach, Florida.

Gentlemen:

With reference to your desire to have all the books and records of the Town kept and maintained at the Town Hall in Golden Beach, and to have as much as possible of the work of the Town Clerk, the Tax Assessor and the Tax Collector performed by your present Town Clerk, Mrs. Kuiken, instead of by myself as the Deputy Town Clerk, I have the following report.

- I have met with the Committee appointed by your President at your meeting on March 21, 1950 and conferred with Mrs. Kuiken and explored carefully the problems involved and the technical capabilities of Mrs. Kuiken to perform the work. As a result, the following proposal is submitted for your consideration:
- (1) As expeditiously as possible, all of the Town's books and records now in my office at 1110 Pan American Bank Building, Miami, Florida, will be transferred to your Town Hall; necessary filing cabinets and safes will be provided by the Town to properly safeguard these records.
