

ORDINANCE NO. 39

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUILDING AND PLUMBING
CODE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH AND REGULATING
THE TYPE AND INSTALLATION OF SEA WALLS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH,
FLORIDA:

Section 1. Article No. 78 of the Electrical Code of
the Town of Golden Beach be and the same is hereby amended by
adding to said Article No. 78 the following:

"Number fourteen (14) wire shall be used
for lighting circuits, only, and number
twelve (12) wire to all convenience out-
lets.

All water heater equipment shall have
number ten (#10) wire fused on both
sides, and this also applies to all re-
placements".

Sec. 2. Article No. 79 of the Building Code of the
Town of Golden Beach be and the same is hereby amended by add-
ing to said Article No. 79 the following:

"Where a grounding conductor is connected to
a water system, or driven ground of galvan-
ized metal pipe, with well point, the
ground connection shall be visible and ac-
cessible. This section must be fully
complied with".

Sec. 3. Article No. 61 of the Plumbing Code of the
Town of Golden Beach be and the same is hereby amended by add-
ing to said Article 61 the following:

"All hot water boilers, tanks, or heaters
must be provided with a temperature re-
lief valve, located in the hot water line,
where it leaves the tank, boiler or heater.
Control valves, drains and relief valves
must be placed so they are visible and
accessible."

Sec. 4. On the main waterway or Intracoastal canal
and approaches, all sea walls shall be of the standard ap-
proved interlocking type made of concrete slabs at least 18
inches to 2 feet wide and 8 inches thick and said concrete
slabs shall be jetted or driven to rock.

On all interior waterways a concrete slab type of
sea wall shall be permitted, but each slab must be supported
on concrete piling driven to bed rock and such slabs shall
penetrate into the berm at least 2 feet.


All sea walls shall be capped with concrete and
said caps shall be at least 2 feet in width.

All sea walls constructed within the Town of Golden
Beach must be tied back to the lot and such tie-back shall be
in accordance with the best methods now available and after
the same are completed all sea walls must be back-filled.

Sec. 5. All parts of the Building, Electrical and Plumbing Code in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
