

ORDINANCE NO. 40

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 31 REGULATING THE TYING UP OR DOCKING OF BOATS TO PROPERTY WITHIN THE WATERWAYS OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 31, passed the 15th day of January, 1946, the living on houseboats and motor vessels was prohibited except under certain conditions, and

WHEREAS, because of the lack of facilities within the Town of Golden Beach for tying up boats belonging to residents, the property owners were suffering hardship in keeping their boats docked in the Town waterways;


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:


Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 31 be and the same is hereby amended so that said Section 1 shall read as follows:

Section 1. That no boat, whether houseboat, pleasure craft or barge upon which persons are living and sleeping, shall be permitted to tie up to any property within the limits of the waterways of the Town of Golden Beach unless the property to which said boat or barge may tie up to shall have thereon a residence or other building and be equipped with septic tanks; provided, however, that residents of the Town of Golden Beach who shall own a houseboat, pleasure craft or other motor vessel which may have sleeping accommodations thereon and a crew living thereon may be permitted to tie up the same within the Town limits of the Town of Golden Beach without connecting to septic tanks. Provided, further, that boats under 50 feet shall be allowed a one-man crew aboard at all times and boats over 50 feet shall be allowed a two-man crew aboard at all times.


Sec. 2. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary to the health and public safety of the inhabitants of the Town of Golden Beach and shall become a law immediately upon its passage by the Town Council and approval by the Mayor.
