

ORDINANCE NO. 44

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND SANITATION OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH AND REGULATING THE ERECTION OF WALLS IN BUILDINGS IN THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. All residences which may hereafter be erected within the Town of Golden Beach having exterior walls constructed of cement block or any other type of hollow tile shall have the interior of said dwelling furred out at least $3/4$ ths of an inch for air space between the interior side of the block or tile and the plaster or lath and all such buildings shall be plastered in the usual manner.

Sec. 2. All buildings located within the Town of Golden Beach having exterior walls constructed of cement block or any other type of hollow tile or masonry, shall have the exterior of such walls stuccoed with the application of two or more coats of approved cement mortar.

Sec. 3. Violation of this Ordinance shall be punishable as provided for like offenses as set forth in the Building Code of the Town of Golden Beach.

Sec. 4. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure, necessary to the health, welfare and safety of the inhabitants of the Town of Golden Beach and shall become a law immediately upon its passage by the Town Council and approval by the Mayor.
