RESOLUTION NO. 1010.96

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH FLORIDA, OPPOSING A PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE ASSESSMENT BY METRO DADE COUNTY OF 3 MILLS, FOR THE 1996/97 FISCAL YEAR; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Dade County Board of County Commissioners approved (on September 17, 1996) the placement of a non-binding straw poll on the November 5, 1996 General Election Ballot; and

WHEREAS, the straw poll inquires whether the County should consider implementing a 3 mill ad valorem tax Municipal Revenue Sharing Pool to be collected all Dade County ad valorem taxpayers, but paid to only those unincorporated areas in of funding and sharing the revenue based upon the population of the recipient area; ar

WHEREAS, the Town does not approve of such an additional tax which is a con proposal to avoid an increase in a municipal services tax;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Town is opposed to the implementation of such a Municipal Revenue Sharing Pool from all Dade County taxpayers as a way of avoiding an increase the Municipal Services Tax. This is an unfair shift of the tax burden on those residents property owners in the municipalities in Dade County.
