RESOLUTION NO. 998.96 A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA; APPROVING THE STATEWIDE MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT; PROVIDING FOR EXECUTION OF THE AGREEMENT; PROVIDING FOR DESIGNATION OF TOWN REPRESENTATIVES; PROVIDING FOR CONFIRMATION OF INSURANCE COVERAGE BY THE TOWN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town desires to provide for the health, safety and welfare of its residents and their property, as well as the Town's property to the best of its ability during a hurricane, flood, or other catastrophic disaster; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida, through the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Emergency Management has proposed a "Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement", (formerly known as a "Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement for Catastrophic Disaster Response and Recovery" (hereinafter Referred to as "SMAAA")); and

WHEREAS, the SMAA participation is voluntary but provides a mechanism for obtaining and providing disaster assistance or assistance during lesser emergencies from other cities or counties throughout the State, when a municipality or county is unable to be responsive to its own needs; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council discussed the SMAA at its August 13, 1996 meeting and the SMAA has been reviewed by the Town Attorney and the Town now makes its designations required by the agreement;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That the "Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement For Catastrophic Disaster Response and Recovery" and "Modification #1 to the Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement" ("SMAA" collectively) are hereby approved; and the mayor and other Town Officials are hereby authorized and directed to execute the SMAA and send it to the appropriate emergency preparedness office(s) in the state.

Section 2. That the Representatives are hereby designated under the "SMAA" as follows:

- Primary Representative - MAYOR (Judy Cuenca)
- 1st Alternate Representative - TOWN MANAGER (Nancy Ciunmo)
- 2nd Alternate Representative - CHIEF OF POLICE (Richard Witt)

The appointment of these Representatives may be amended by the Town Manager, from time to time, with notice in writing to the State Emergency Preparedness Office, the Town Council, the former Representatives and the newly appointed Representatives as soon after the amendment by the Town Manager as possible.

Section 3. That the Town Manager and Town Attorney are authorized and directed to obtain the appropriate certificates of insurance for the Town as required by the SMAA.

Section 4. That the Town manager and the Town Attorney shall distribute the appropriately executed SMAAA agreements and copies as required by the State and the SMAAA.

Section 5. Should any provisions of this Resolution be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Resolution as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part declared to be invalid.

Section 6. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. That this Resolution shall become effective upon approval of the Town Council.
