RESOLUTION NO. 1828.07

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, APPOINTING LINDA KROPP TO THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, on January 17, 2006, the Town Council of the Town of Golden Beach adopted Ordinance No.502.06, codifying the establishment of the Recreation Advisory Committee (the "Committee") ;

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council finds it to be in the best interest of the citizens of the Town to appoint Linda Kropp to serve as a member of the Committee for a one-year term, allowing for re-appointment.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Recitals Adopted.** That the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

**Section 2. Appointment and Term.** That the Town Council hereby appoints Linda Kropp to serve as a member of the Committee for an initial term through January 2008, allowing for re-appointment.

**Section 3. Implementation.** That the Mayor and Town Manager are authorized to take any and all action which is necessary to implement this Resolution.

**Section 4. Effective Date.** That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
