A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUST FUND FOR THE PURCHASE OF CODE RED MESSAGING SYSTEM ANNUAL FEE FOR THE GOLDEN BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Golden Beach, Florida (the "Town") wishes to the Code Red Messaging System to alert the residents with information that needs to be given in a quick and expeditious manner as described and outlined in the attached Agenda Item Report; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council wishes to use monies from the Town's Law Enforcement

Trust Fund for the purchase the first year of this service; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Town's purchasing procedures, the Town Manager has cortified that this service described does not require competitive bids; and

WHEREAS, upon finding that the proposal submitted by Code Red, has met the provisions of Section 2-266 of the Town Code; and

WHEREAS, the Town Chief of Police has provided written certification that the requested expenditure complies with Section 932.7055, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that the expenditure of funds from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund for these purposes is in the best interest of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals Adopted. That each of the above-stated recitals is hereby

Section 2. Authorization. The expenditure of funds from the Town of Golden Beach
Law Enforcement Trust Fund in an amount not more than \$5,000.00, as described and outlined in
the Agenda Item Report attached and incorporated herein, is hereby authorized and approved.

Section 4. Implementation. That the Mayor and Town Manager are authorized to take

any and all action which is necessary to implement this Resolution.

Section 5. Effective Date. That this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

Additional Information On Colle Red System - Excess of 12,500 minutes

I contacted Mr. David Digiacomo, 1-386-676-0294, the Vice President for Service for the Code Red System of the Emergency Communications System. He provided Lt. Gary Smith with the original information regarding the Code Red System.

Mr. Digiacomo advised me the company has a flat rate of 40 cents per minute. If the Town used an additional 1,000 minutes as an example, the cost would be \$400. He states that many municipalities find this very useful.

He cited an example where one City experienced a contractor puncturing a water main with a back hoe. That City was able to bill the contractor for the total amount of minutes used to notify the residents of a "boiled water" alert because of the contractor's negligence. That City was then reimbursed for the cost of the emergency notification for that situation.

Additional Information On Code\Red System

I contacted Mr. Christopher Cornelison, 1-888-848-6337, ext 111, Vice President for Sales for the Code Red System of the Emergency Communications System. He advised the following additional information regarding the service provided in the \$5,000 yearly fee:

- 1. The Town will receive 12,500 minutes per year of message service for the annual fee.
- 2. The system can record a message as long as two and half minutes in length. He said the typical message sent out is 30 seconds long so this would enable Golden Beach to transmit 25,000 thirty-second messages annually.
- 3. Messages can be sent to as many phone numbers as desired because the charge is based upon minutes or seconds used, not the number of phone dialed. Code Red uses a national phone number data bank which already has forty to seventy percent of all Golden Beach phone numbers available. The Town will add the remainder at no charge.
- 4. The subscribing entity calls a specified number to record and then immediately transmit their message to the identified subscribers.
- 5. Text messages to cell phones and computers are assessed at a flat rate of six (6) second per e-mail message. The Town can send audio or text messages to as many phone numbers or e-mail addresses as it desires.
- 6. If every one of the 350 residences in Golden Beach listed three phone numbers to be called (one residence phone number and two cell phone numbers), every of the 1,050 phone numbers could received one thirty second message every two weeks.
- 7. This voice mail broadcasting system will automatically call all 1,050 phone numbers within 30 seconds to four minutes depending on the local phone system's ability to handle that many incoming calls at the same time.

Additional Information on Automatic Resident Notification Systems

In response to the Town Council's request for more information on automatic resident notification system, the Police Department was able to identify two additional systems that provide automatic notification systems for residents. These can be purchased either as services or as hardware for existing systems. Because of the location of Golden Beach on a barrier island, it is recommended the Town purchase a service option rather than hardware and software.

The three systems and the price quotes received are:

"Code Red"

- \$5,000 first year and annual cost

Emergency Communications Network of Ormond Beach, Florida, 1-888-848-6337 Vice President David DiGiacomo states 35% of all Florida Counties and 18% of all Florida communities are subscribers. South Florida customers include: Broward County Emergency Manager, Coral Gables, Coral Springs, Coconut Creek Cooper City, Hallandale Beach, Oakland Park, West Palm Beach, Weston, Miramar, and Margate

"Red alert"

- \$10,000 first year and annual cost

AMTELCO of McFarland, Wisconsin, 1-800-380-7345

Regional Manager Tim Brady states the cost listed above is the approximate and subsequent annual costs.

"Universal Alert"

- \$4,300 first year and \$4,000 annual cost

Omni Distribution, LLC of Newark, New jersey, 1-973-242-4431

Sales Representative Joe Kolakowski states they have no Florida customers at this time \however; their customers do include: Yankee Stadium, Giant Stadium, and the Contego System Deicing Operations at the JFK, LaGuardia, Newark, and Anchorage Airports

Based upon the large usage by many Florida municipalities and county governments. the Police Department recommends the purchase of the Code Red system.




