A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, RECOGNIZING OCTOBER AS NATIONAL BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH.

WHEREAS, October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer can afflict anyone, men included, it is the most common cancer among women; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in women, exceeded only by lung cancer; and

WHEREAS, the chance of developing invasive breast cancer at some time in a woman's life is about 1 in 7; and

WHEREAS, African American women are disproportionately affected by breast cancer deaths; and

*WHEREAS, death rates from breast cancer have been declining and this change is believed to be the result of earlier detection and improved treatment; and

WHEREAS, mammography, and "x-ray" of the breast, is recognized as the single most effective method of detecting breast changes that may be cancer long before physical symptoms can be seen or felt.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Hereby proclaims Breast Cancer Awareness Month in the Town of Golden Beach, Florida.

<u>Section 2.</u> That the Town of Golden Beach urges all citizens to make sure that the women they care about seek regular breast cancer screenings.
