he new gate arm security and monitoring system has been installed. It is imperative that all residents fill out and return the transponder package to Town Hall in order to register the vehicles and obtain the new transponders and parking decals. For security reasons, if a resident does not register his or her auto, they will be required to drive through the guest lane and may be

subject to a citation for violating the Town Code which will cost the resident \$150.00 each and every time. (There will be a two week grace period.)

Many residents enjoyed the weekly food trucks which the Town has been providing for our residents and their guests at the Beach Pavilion during the summer. The feedback that we have received is appreciated. We will have more of these types of services throughout the coming year.

We hope everyone enjoyed our Halloween event at North Park and our annual Veteran's Day observance at the Beach Pavilion. The Halloween event is by far my favorite Town sponsored event of the year. Especially problematic is what is termed "King Tides" which occur twice a year.

We installed our new pump system which works expressly hard when these rising tides occur. However, our flooding incident did not last long and we are extremely grateful that we have not experienced flooding like several other major areas around the country.

I hope everyone is enjoyed the beautiful pink lights on A1A as we recognized Breast Cancer Awareness month. It is an honor for the Town to show our support and how much we believe in this fight against breast cancer.

Please know that the Town Council and I, with the help of the Town Manager and Staff will continue to work diligently to maintain the Town of Golden Beach in a manner that makes you glad to call it "home".












## Police BEAT

## Ongoing Iguana Treatment throughout Town

Due to multiple requests from residents, the Town is continuing its iguana control initiative. The Town has representatives from Trutech Wildlife Control exploring areas of concern. Technicians will be surveying parts of Town where iguanas are likely to gather most or have been spotted congregating, particularly along sea walls. Please be aware that technicians may be armed with air rifles during the eradication process. We ask for your cooperation in granting access to your yards for these authorized technicians during this process. PLEASE NOTE that the iguana control process will thin the number of iguanas over time and should not be considered an immediate extermination of all iguanas in Town.

If you are having issues with iguanas and would like the Town to dispatch the iguana service to your home on the next scheduled visit please email mglidden@ goldenbeach.us with your name, address, and contact number to be added to list. ALSO NOTE that the Town is currently enrolled in a once-a-month iguana service contract and cannot add isolated spot visits in between scheduled service dates. Should residents feel their iguana problem needs immediate attention they are encouraged to hire their own iguana services at their own expense.



## The Listeners/Oyentes Program

We would like to inform you about a wonderful school volunteer program that will provide great benefits to all students of M-DCPS. This program has successfully been a part of M-DCPS for close to 40 years. The Listeners/Oyentes Program is here to support the teachers and counselors by helping to defuse the emotions of the children that our volunteers listen to, so that these students can better absorb the lessons being taught.


The Listeners/Oyentes Program goals are to join the student's world without judgment, to help build positive self-esteem, and to empower them to develop their own excellent problem-solving skills.

- The Listeners/Oyentes Program consistently provides students with the opportunity to communicate with non-judgmental, non-authority caring adult figure in their lives.
- Listeners/Oyentes are not "fixers" or "rescuers". Instead, they are more like "anchors in their student's storms".
- Any student (K-12) may be selected to participate in the program. The objective is to target students who would just simply benefit from being able to share their feelings with a non-judgmental, non-advice giving Listener.
- The Listener/Oyente, which must be cleared at Level 2, meets with each student approximately 30 minutes per week. Consistency is crucial!!
- In order for Listeners/Oyentes to be placed in a particular school, both the school principal and the participating counselor must agree to accept the volunteer and adhere to the guidelines of the program. Student participants are selected by counselors or by faculty members. Students may also request a Listener by going to our web site. "Listening" may be terminated upon request by the student, listener, counselor, teacher, or parent.

## Listeners/Oyentes Program Listeners **Training Schedule** 2015-2016



This program is jointly sponsored by Miami-Dade County Public Schools' Office of Community Engagement and The Francine and Herbert Tobin Foundation. The Listeners/Oyentes Program has been servicing students by providing them with special one-on-one attention since 1972.

Anyone interested in becoming a volunteer Listener/Oyente must register and attend one of the training sessions listed below. Once the training has been completed, the volunteer selects a school that is geographically convenient for the weekly listening sessions. The Miami-Dade County Public Schools' Volunteer Program conducts a fingerprint background check for all Level 2 volunteers. Listeners/Oyentes are considered Level 2 volunteers, and require a fingerprint background check before becoming a Listener/Oyente volunteer.

#### TO REGISTER, PLEASE CALL MS. FRANCINE TOBIN, CHAIRPERSON OF THE LISTENERS/ OYENTES PROGRAM AT (305) 935-0045, OR THE OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AT (305) 995-2995.

In addition to attending a 3-hour training, volunteer Listeners/Oyentes must attend a minimum of 4 on-going training and monitoring workshops per school year in order to remain as an active Listener/Oyente (these workshops are offered twice monthly throughout the school year).
