A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, RECOGNIZING MAY 15th AS POLICE MEMORIAL DAY AND MAY 10th THROUGH MAY 16th AS NATIONAL POLICE WEEK; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in October of 1962, Congress passed a new law designating May 15th of each year as PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY, when the entire nation is called upon to pay homage to these dedicated men and women in the law enforcement profession who have been killed in the line of duty and

WHEREAS, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial reports that the total number of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty since our country declared it independence has reached 18,832, which includes 705 in Florida, and of that number, 124 died in the line of duty in Miami-Dade County,

WHEREAS, the residents and Town Council of Golden Beach want to honor the memory of those Law Enforcement Officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice by giving their own lives while in the line of duty – and in furtherance of their commitment to keep others safe; and

WHEREAS, on the special day of May 15th, the residents of Golden Beach look forward to expressing their deep gratitude and appreciation to all of the law enforcement officers who gave their lives in the service of others;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:
