A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, RECOGNIZING OCTOBER 23rd THROUGH OCTOBER 31st AS NATIONAL RED RIBBON WEEK; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on February 7, 1985, United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Agent Enrique "Kikki" Camarena was kidnapped, tortured, and then murdered while working in Mexico investigating drug cartels and

WHEREAS, within weeks of his death, Camarena's Congressman, Duncan Hunter, and high school friend Henry Lozano, launched Camarena Clubs in Imperial Valley, California, Camarena's home and hundreds of club members pledged to lead drug-free lives to honor the sacrifices made by Camarena and others on behalf of all Americans.

WHEREAS, these coalitions began to wear red badges of satin, red ribbons, as a symbol of Camarena's memory and the Red Ribbon Week campaign emerged from the efforts of these clubs and coalitions into a program in which more than 80 million people across the county wear red during National Red Ribbon Week to show their support for a healthy, drug-free lifestyle and the Ribbon Campaign is now recognized annually the last week of October and this year is being recognized in Florida on October 23rd to the 31st, 2010, and

WHEREAS, the residents and Town Council of Golden Beach want to honor the memory of DEA Agent Kikki Camarena and in furtherance of the Red Ribbon Campaign for everyone to make a personal commitment to lead a healthy, drug-free lifestyle.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:
