Letter FROM THE MAYOR

would like to thank the residents of Golden Beach for having faith and confidence in me as I begin another term as Mayor. I am about to enter my 7th term as your Mayor. I cannot explain in words what an honor and a pleasure it has been to serve this community for these past 12 years.

I have to thank the Town staff and the Town Manager and my fellow Council Members for working as a team to complete the vision I started over 12 years ago. We still have many projects to complete and I look forward to achieving our goals over the next 2 years.

There are several upcoming projects that we will be working on. One of these is the Town's street lighting project. It has been determined that street lighting is a vital element in creating safe and secure cities and towns by preventing accidents and increasing pedestrian safety. Proper lighting can also act as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Other projects include the canal maintenance project, the police gatehouse renovation project and the beach pavilion renovation project. The Town Manager and I have been meeting with the Department of Environmental Resources Management to address the canal maintenance project.

We are also addressing the Center Island drainage issues and we have given the Town's engineers the task of coming up with a solution to the flooding problems in Town. We are exploring solutions to the beach erosion issue and are working to come up with a solution.

These projects are big projects and all take a significant amount of time and money. The Town Manager and I have met with the Town's lobbyist to review all of the Town projects and are looking for all types of funding that is available to cover the financial burden of these projects. A long term goal is to build a new town hall and civic center. This, however, is still in the planning stages. The town manager and I will also be traveling both to Tallahassee and Washington DC this year to try to secure any funding the Town of Golden Beach can obtain.

Once again thank you for all your support and confidence in electing me as your Mayor and if there is ever anything I can assist you with, or if you have any suggestions or comments, please do not hesitate to contact me at my town office. I wish you all a happy and healthy New Year.

Under the tenure of a diligent and attentive Mayor and Council, Town Manager Alexander Diaz, who celebrates 10 years with the Town this year, has worked tirelessly to make the dreams of those who reside in Golden Beach a reality. Let's look back and see how far we've come. After PHOTOS

In recent years, the Town has undergone several monumental projects including:

Beautification and Quality-of-Life Initiatives:

- \$2 Million worth of new Medjool palm trees and landscaping along Ocean Boulevard and Golden Beach Drive.
- Lush landscaping has been added throughout
 Town
- Extensive renovations to The Strand Gatehouse
- New gate arm system
- 77 Closed Circuit Television cameras (CCTV)
 have been added within the Town. For added
 security, cameras capture and record license
 plate information for all cars that enter through
 the Strand Gatehouse.
- North & South Park renovations including landscaping redesigns and addition of sound system to South Park
- Tweddle Park renovations including fully remodeled tennis courts, basketball courts and addition of dog park.
- Complete overhaul of the former "Rock Park" into Singer Park, with new landscaping, masonry and water feature.
- Addition of sidewalks to Golden Beach Drive for safety and aesthetics
- Upgrades to the Beach Pavilion, including renovations & restoration, new beach chairs and beach beds, a brand new turf area leading up the east side of the pavilion.
- Updates to street signage for a more attractive polished look
- Upgrades to street lighting, including new fixtures on bridges

Utilities:

Undergrounding electricity and removal of overhead wires and poles for more reliable electricity and added curb appeal.











Bridges:


During the Town's Capital Improvement Project, two of the Town's three bridges were completely rebuilt from the pilings up.

Stormwater:

An extensive \$8.5 Million project to ameliorate flooding issues within the Town by mitigating rain waters and coastal tides has helped offset water issues that had plagued the Town in recent years.

Police:

The Town's police department has expanded and modernized. Segways, Bicycles, Police Cars, Motorcycle, and a new K-9 officer have all been added for a more equipped and effective department. The Police Boat Dock at the Strand has also bolstered the Town's police presence out on the water.










Police BEAT

017 is already well underway; I hope everyone has had a healthy and prosperous start to the New Year. 2016 was a banner year for the Golden Beach Police Department filled with numerous accomplishments; I am humbled that the Mayor, Councilmembers, and the Town Manager continue to show me their support as I strive to serve you better. Reflecting on the past year, I would like to thank the men and women of the Golden Beach Police Department for their continuous hard work and dedication to the Town of Golden Beach and its residents.



Some of the exemplary accomplishments are;

- The Golden Beach Police Department was re-accredited by the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Agencies (CFA) following an in-depth assessment where all applicable standards and policies were reviewed for compliance with CFA.
- Purchase of a K-9 officer police dog, and a Mobile Command Post (MCP). Both the new K-9 officer and the MCP will enable the Police Department's

ability to provide better service and secure our Town.

 We lowered calls for service 20.5%; Crime/Information reports 52%, while increasing the Marine Patrol yearly



- activities 25% and the Motorcycle Unit yearly activity to 98%
- **In regards to Community Relations activities,** the Department participated in the following;
 - 1. The "Florida DMV event" saved residents a trip to the Department of Motor Vehicle Office by offering license renewals at a portable station parked at our own Beach Pavilion.
 - The "Back to School event" which was held on the first day of school. Students received goodie bags including fruits and pencils, crayons, school supplies and some fun treats.
 - Officers attended the OJUS Elementary School "Career Day" event and spoke with students about Law Enforcement.
 - 4. We participated in the drug abuse awareness event "Red Ribbon Week." The Department ran a campaign where residents were able to safely dispose of unused and expired medication.
 - GBPD sponsored the "Child Safety Inspection Day." Residents could have their car seats examined to insure proper seats placement.
 - 6. We hosted three **boating classes** with the U.S Coast Guard at Town Hall
 - 7. The Department hosted the "National Night Out" at the Beach Pavilion, an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live.



These events were organized by Golden Beach Police Staff as a way to network with our residents and further our commitment to community involvement. We encourage our residents not only to participate but to give us feedback on how we can better accommodate their requests. As we continue forward in 2017, we are already working on new programs. Teaming up with Councilmember Judy Lusskin the Department will be sponsoring a "Sports Day with the Golden Beach Youth Leadership Group." Councilmember Lusskin is not only the founder of the Town's youth group, but through group meetings, outreach initiatives and character building activities she has remained committed to the development and success of every member of the program. In an effort to have our Department bond with our young people, Councilmember Lusskin is teaming up with members of the police department to organize the

event. The Golden Beach Police Department is also planning numerous upcoming events through our Community Involvement Specialist, Sergeant Leila Perez. As always, all future events will be announced through the Town Magazine, flyers, and/or the Town's closed circuit TV channel, Channel 89.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the winners of the "Officer of the Quarter Award" throughout the 2016 calendar year; this year the honor was bestowed on Officers Oscar Suarez and Robert Perez, Detective Dan Rosenberg and Sgt. Leila Perez. On behalf of the Golden Beach Police Department I would like to thank these officers for their outstanding work.

A special message from your Town Council:

First of all, we would like to thank the residents of Golden Beach for their continued confidence in our leadership and ability to do what is in the best for our community. As a team, we have completed multiple projects to help better life in Golden Beach. Recently we have helped shape the Town's new Landscape Ordinance to assure consistency of quality and beauty throughout Town. To add appeal, along with safety, we added bollards at the Strand entrance of Town; these poles help direct traffic and add a level of finish to the Town's main entrance. As an effort to protect our residents from a potentially serious health emergency, we enacted a swift and decisive plan to eradicate the possibility of Zika mosquitos breeding in Town. Part of our antimosquito efforts addressed proper drainage, the curbs and gutters project, a \$300,000 initiative, helped combat areas of standing water along with controlling localized flooding. This past year we offered brand new initiatives for residents, including a free self-defense clinic, hosted by the Golden Beach Youth Leadership Group.

In the 2015-2016 year alone we heard and approved over 30 Town Resolutions, relating to policy, administration, purchasing, and other legislative acts. Under our tenure we approved exclusive use of John Tweddle Park for use of Town residents and their guests, making the use of the Town's newly renovated tennis courts, basketball courts and playground a perk available only to those living in Golden Beach and their accompanied guests. As a way to bolster our Town's police force we approved adding an additional Police Canine (K-9). To help alleviate flooding and assist drainage we approved a proposal from Southeastern Engineering to work on the Outfalls on Center Island. Adding a little summer fun to our Town's Beach Pavilion we offered residents complimentary food and drinks every other weekend for the months of August and September. In keeping the Town's finances as one of our top priorities, we were also able to upgrade the Town's rating with Moody's Investors Service, no small feat as Golden Beach is the smallest municipality that Moody's rates. We are excited as to what the future holds for the Town of Golden Beach.

In closing we would like to thank you again for your support. We look forward to continuing to service residents and their families in the coming years.









Mayor Glenn Singer

Mayor Glenn Singer was first elected to the Town Council in 2001 and subsequently elected for his first term as Mayor in 2005. He has placed the successful growth and development of his community among his highest priorities. Mayor Singer's many accomplishments throughout his administration, includes the implementation of a Marine Patrol, the establishment of the Town's canine park, overseeing the Town's purchase of two vacant lots that were subsequently earmarked for green space, renovation of the Town's Police Substation, and more recently the Town's historic Beach Pavilion. Both renovation projects were completed on time and were within the established budgets. The Town also replaced two of its three bridges.





Councilmember Judy Lusskin

Councilmember Judy Lusskin was first elected to the Town Council in 2005 and is currently serving her 3rd term. Councilmember Lusskin was Program Director for the Michael-Ann Russell Jewish Community Center for 15 years where she was responsible for a multitude of programs, from infant day care to teen programming. She founded the Golden Beach Youth Leadership Group, Co-Chaired the Town's Anniversary Celebration committee, and has been an active member of several of the Town's advisory boards and committees. In addition Councilmember Lusskin is the Town's representative on the North Dade Transportation Board and is the Town's Representative to the Miami Dade League of Cities.

Councilmember Bernard Einstein

Councilmember Bernard Einstein is the longest sitting Councilmember, having first been elected to the Town Council in February 1999. He has also served on the Town's General Employees' Pension Board. Mr. Einstein has been a practicing member of the Florida Bar since 1978 and specializes in real estate transactions, title insurance, wills, trusts, and estates.



Vice Mayor Kenneth R. Bernstein

Vice Mayor Kenneth R. Bernstein is the Senior Vice President and General Counsel for Turnberry Associates, a national real estate company which has managed and/or developed more than \$7 billion dollars in commercial and residential properties.

Mr. Bernstein is a member of the Florida Bar and a Certified Public Accountant in the State of Florida, as well as a licensed Mortgage Broker. Since 2004, he has served as a Board of Director for Great Florida Bank, a NASDAQ company with \$1.7 billion dollars of assets as of March 31, 2009. On February 21, 2017 the Town will be holding its election for two seats on the Town Council. You may have some questions as to how the whole process works. We have compiled some of the most frequently asked questions to help residents understand the 2017 Golden Beach Town Council Election process.

Where do I vote?

Voting is in the Town Council Chambers at Town Hall, 1 Golden Beach Drive, Golden Beach, FL 33160.



to any candidate, Town official or Town employee. Voting is being officiated by the Miami-Dade

County Elections Department; your vote for Town Council is treated with the same confidentiality as a vote cast in a Presidential election.

Will candidates be present for the election?

No, candidates are not allowed to enter the polling site while voting is taking place.

When do I vote?

Voting is ONE DAY ONLY, February 21, 2017 from 7:00AM to 7:00PM.

What do I need to bring to vote?

Voters must bring a government issued form of photo ID (driver's license, passport). While voters do not need to bring their voter registration cards to vote in this election, you must be a registered voter to cast a vote.

Is voting confidential?

Yes, voting is completely confidential, who you voted for will never be revealed






Golden Beach Rolls Out High Tech Way to Register Your Pet

We live in a "there's an app for that" world. With your cellphone you can chat with friends, review your finances, and even order Chinese food from the place down the street, all with the swipe of a finger. There's no doubt apps have made our lives more "user-friendly." There's a new app that the Town will be partnering with to keep you and your pets connected. While Fido and Mittens don't have smartphones of their own, there's no reason technology can't help make their lives easier. With the new "Get Me Home" app managed by Pethub, residents will have a new way to find their furry family members if they get lost or wander away from home. Each ID tag has a "QR (Quick Response) Code," which is scannable by any smartphone. Residents will be able to create an Online Pet Profile complete with owner information and critical pet data. An image and stats of the pet, its license number and any health information are all pulled up simply by scanning the QR code. In the event their pet gets lost, residents will be able to reach a staffed Pethub call center 24/7; Pethub reports that 96% of pets are returned home in less than 24 hours. The Town of Golden Beach and Pethub want to keep you and your pets where they belong, within snuggling distance. 


Arbor Day Foundation Recognizes Town

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
