

**TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA**

**RESOLUTION NO. 1182.99**

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, ACCEPTING A PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE FOR THE 1999-2000 FISCAL YEAR; ALSO COMPUTING A ROLL-BACK RATE; PROVIDING FOR THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE AT WHICH A PUBLIC HEARING WILL BE HELD TO CONSIDER THE PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE AND TENTATIVE BUDGET; DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE TOWN OFFICIALS TO ADVISE THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER'S OFFICE OF THE INFORMATION CONTAINED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, the Town has computed a proposed millage rate for the 1999/2000 fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town has also computed a roll-back millage rate based on the taxable value within the Town that has been certified by the Miami-Dade County Property Appraiser's Office; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to advise the Property Appraiser's Office of the date, time and place of the first public hearing at which the tentative millage rate and a tentative budget will be considered;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1.** That the Town Council hereby accepts a proposed millage rate in the amount of 8.59 mills, which is equivalent to \$8.59 per \$1,000 of taxable assessed property valuation, for the 1999/2000 fiscal year.

**Section 2.** That the roll-back millage rate has been computed to be 7.91 mills, based on the certification of taxable value provided by the Property Appraiser's Office.

**Section 3.** That a first public hearing is hereby scheduled to be held the 9th day of September, 1999 at 7:30 p.m. in Town Hall (One Golden Beach Drive, Golden Beach, Florida).

**Section 4.** That a second public hearing is scheduled to be held on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of September, 1999 at 7:30 PM in Town Hall (One Golden Beach Drive, Golden Beach, Florida).

**Section 5.** That the appropriate Town officials are hereby authorized and directed to advise the Miami-Dade County Property Appraiser's Office of the information contained in this Resolution.

**Section 6. Severability.** That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

**Section 7. Conflict.** That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.


**Section 8. Effective Date.** That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.


The Motion to adopt the foregoing Resolution was offered by Mayor Addicott, seconded by Councilmember Feinman and on roll call the following vote ensued:


