RESOLUTION NO. 1201A.99

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA; ADOPTING THE FINAL MILLAGE RATE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 1999, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2000, PURSUANT TO FLORIDA STATUTES SECTION 200.065 (TRIM BILL); PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on September 9, 1999, the Mayor and Town Manager presented to the Town Council a proposed millage rate for fiscal year commencing October 1, 1999, which was tentatively approved by the Town Council by Resolution No. 1178.99; and

WHEREAS, the Town had originally noticed the second public hearing scheduled for September 21st, 1999, but through an error by Miami Herald, this notice did not appear properly; and

WHEREAS, the Town has properly noticed the second public hearing scheduled for November 30th, 1999, at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Town Hall located at One Golden Beach Drive, Golden Beach, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the said second public hearing was held as noticed and the public and all interested parties having had an opportunity to address their comments to the Town Council and having complied with the "TRIM" requirements of the Florida Statutes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the final millage rate as presented by the Mayor and the Town Manager for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, be and is hereby fixed at the rate of 8.59 mills which is \$8.59 per one thousand dollars of assessed property value within the Town of Golden Beach.

Section 2. That the "rolled back rate" for the Town of Golden Beach is 7.91 mills and that the final millage rate of 8.59 mills is 8.60% above the "rolled back rate."

Section 3. Severability. That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.


Section 4. Conflict. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. Effective Date. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.


The Motion to adopt the foregoing Resolution was offered by Councilman Einstein, seconded by Councilman Feinman and on roll call the following vote ensued:


