GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA RESOLUTION NO. 1257.00

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA; ADOPTING TENTATIVE MILLAGE RATE OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2000 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2001, PURSUANT TO SECTION 200.065, FLORIDA STATUTES (TRIM BILL); SETTING THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO ADOPT THE FINAL MILLAGE RATE FOR THE TOWN OF GOLDEN AUTHORIZING THE TOWN CLERK TO ADVERTISE THE PUBLIC HEARING; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Town has properly noticed the first public hearing scheduled for Tuesday, September 5, 2000, at 7:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Town Hall located at One Golden Beach Drive, Golden Beach, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the said first public hearing was held as noticed and the public and all interested parties having had an opportunity to address their comments to the Town Council and having complied with the "TRIM" requirements of the Florida Statutes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the tentative millage rate as presented by the Town Manager for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, be and is hereby fixed at the rate of 8.59 mills which is \$8.59 per one thousand dollars of assessed property value within the Town of Golden Beach.

Section 2. That the "rolled back rate" for the Town of Golden Beach is <u>8.15</u> mills and that the tentative millage rate of 8.59 mills is <u>5.398%</u> above the "rolled back rate."

Section 3. That the second public hearing required by Section 200.065 of the Florida Statutes to adopt a final millage rate for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, be and is hereby set in the Town Council Chambers, One Golden Beach Drive, Golden Beach, Florida, at 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, September 19, 2000.

Section 4. That the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to advertise the said public hearing as required by law.

Section 5. Severability. That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

Section 6. Conflict. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 7.</u> Effective Date. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.
