RESOLUTION NO. 1446.03

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE BUDGETARY TRANSFER OF FUNDS AS A RESULT OF THE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT WITH THE POLICE BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION; AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR RETROACTIVE PAY AND BENEFITS FOR PBA MEMBERS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Town officials are hereby authorized and directed to make the appropriate budgetary transfers to fund the Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Dade County Police Benevolent Association including all funds necessary for retroactive salaries and benefits.

Section 2. Severability. That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

Section 3. Conflict. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Effective Date. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.



The Motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was offered by Councilmember Paruas, seconded by Councilmember Singer and on roll call the following vote ensued:


