A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA CERTIFYING THE RESULTS OF THE FEBRUARY 18, 2003 TOWN ELECTION FOR MAYOR AND TWO TOWN COUNCILMEMBERS AND CERTIFYING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION FOR TWO CHARTER AMENDMENTS; DESIGNATING THE VICE MAYOR; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to law and properly noticed, a municipal election was held on February 18, 2003, in the Town of Golden Beach, and a special election was held for two Charter amendments; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to accept the certification of the results of the election and special election and designate a Vice Mayor pursuant to the Town Charter;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Certification of the results of the February 18, 2003 town election is accepted as follows:

- Section 2. A. That based upon the results, <u>Michael Addicott</u> is declared Mayor for a two-year term commencing immediately.
 - B. That based upon the results, <u>Jose M. Iglesias</u> is declared Town Councilmember for a four year term, commencing immediately.
 - C. That based upon the results, <u>Al Paruas</u> is declared Town Councilmember for a four year term, commencing immediately.
- <u>Section 3.</u> That Jose M. Iglesias is hereby designated Vice Mayor for a one-year term commencing immediately, to be followed by Al Paruas, Vice Mayor for the succeeding one-year term as decided by the Town Council.

Section 4. Severability. That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

<u>Section 5. Conflict.</u> That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 6.</u> Effective Date. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.
