A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN AN AGREEMENT WITH BUCKLEY CONSTRUCTION, INC. FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE GOLDEN BEACH PAVILION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Town Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to sign an Agreement with Buckley Construction, Inc. for the renovation of the Golden Beach Pavilion. Said Agreement is subject to approval by the Mayor and Town Attorney, and shall provide for elimination of landscaping and lighting and shall provide a schedule to allow use of the property for parties.

Section 2. Severability. That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

Section 3. Conflict. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 4. Effective Date.</u> That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.
