# Police BEAT

ummer time is almost here; schools close, and families head off on vacation. I'm wishing you all a magnificent summer season, however, I must remind everyone that once again it's the time of year to start preparing for the

2019 Atlantic Hurricane Season, which runs from June 1 through November 30th. It's important to keep in mind that your best protection is to prepare early and to take advantage of calmer times to stock up on supplies. Make sure you have at least a



three day supply of food, water and other essentials for every member of your household. As you get ready, consider all aspects of storm preparation, from ensuring that you review your insurance policy and trim trees around your home to creating an evacuation plan that includes arrangements for your pets.

Mother Nature can be very unpredictable and we never know when the first storm of the year may strike. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is predicting a near average season with (13) named storms and (6) hurricanes, with (2) two possible major hurricanes impacting the United States.

For residents whose homes are undergoing construction, in the event a hurricane watch or greater advisory is issued, it is the responsibility of the property owner and/or associate contractor of any on-going construction work to secure all areas of a site. They must fasten down or remove all hazardous objects which include but are not limited to: construction shacks, temporary toilets, roofing tiles, building materials, trash, temporary electric poles, and other unsecured structures. This is mandatory per the Florida Building Code. Those who fail to follow this procedure

will be cited with fines and will be held legally responsible for any damage caused by their failure to secure loose construction equipment or items.

I am very happy to inform everyone that the last quarter of 2018 and the first quarter of 2019 have been very quiet; our proactive police activities were bolstered in an effort to keep our community safe through the holidays and into the new year. During the month of March 2019 the Golden Beach Police Department arrested 25 individuals; 21 of them for traffic related offenses, 3 of them for misdemeanor offenses and 1 was for a felony arrest. Additionally, the GBPD issued 414 citations for traffic violations, while the Marine Patrol issued 162 citations/warnings. I expect the monthly statistics for the month of April to mirror the statistical reports for January through March 2019.

Members of the Golden Beach Police Department are always motivated to bring new and innovative ideas for securing the safety of our residents, as well as networking with our community. In an effort to partner with Golden Beach residents we are currently holding Neighborhood Community meetings around the Town. The GBPD has already met with residents from North and Center Islands with meetings for the remaining residents coming soon. The purpose of these meetings are threefold; first for us to have a face to face meeting where we can familiarize ourselves; second so we may hear your concerns and ideas, and finally so you may hear our concerns, ideas and the latest intelligence information. We will announce the dates for upcoming Neighborhood Community meetings at least 2 weeks in advance.

During the month of April, your Councilmembers and Chief of Police attended the 2019 Diabetes Research annual dinner at the Diplomat Hotel, an event that aids funding and awareness for the disease. Also the GBPD participated in the Tour de Force, a bicycling event which was founded in 2002 as a memorial bicycle ride to honor the victims of 9/11.



It has evolved into a four-day, 280 mile ride, in which 300 law enforcement officers across the U.S. and abroad, along with some family and friends, participate to raise funds for the families of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

The Golden Beach Police Department is accredited by the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Association. An accreditation program has long been recognized as a means of maintaining the highest standards of professionalism. Accreditation is the certification by an independent reviewing authority that an entity has met specific requirements and prescribed standards. Our agency just went through a mock assessment in preparation for the on-site assessment which is scheduled to occur July 30th, 2019 through August 1st, 2019. During these three days, assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation will be in Town inspecting our administrative files and assuring that we have followed the prescribed standards and also our Standard Operating Procedures. While the assessors are in Town, residents are welcome to share comments with the team through letters or emails.

I want to thank all the residents for your continued support, as we have been receiving calls, emails, and letters of commendation and appreciation. Receiving these gestures of appreciation truly reinforces our daily commitment to every single resident, the Mayor, Town Council and visitors. We are delighted to know that we are appreciated and that you are satisfied with our services, thank you.

# Join Us: Memorial Day Event


