

GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA

RESOLUTION NO. 1134.98

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA; REQUESTING THAT THE BROWARD COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR DIRECT THAT AN ANNEXATION STUDY BE CONDUCTED TO OBTAIN AN OBJECTIVE AND INFORMATIVE ANALYSIS OF BENEFITS AND COSTS TO THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH AND TO BROWARD COUNTY GOVERNMENT, AND CHANGES IN SERVICE PROVIDERS WHICH WOULD RESULT FROM A MOVE OF THE MIAMI-DADE/BROWARD COUNTY BORDER SOUTH OF GOLDEN BEACH TO INCLUDE GOLDEN BEACH IN BROWARD COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Golden Beach is interested in obtaining an annexation study from Broward County so that it may analyze and consider the effects, both monetary and non-monetary in moving the Miami-Dade/Broward County border south to include the Town of Golden Beach in Broward County; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Golden Beach Town Council urges the Broward County Board of County Commissioners and the Broward County Administrator to direct that an annexation study be conducted analyzing the Town of Golden Beach and the monetary and non-monetary effect on the Town's residents and the Town itself, as well as on Broward County, should Golden Beach be included in Broward County.

Section 2. That the study should focus on keeping the students residing in Golden Beach in the same schools.

Section 3. That the Town Council is interested in having the Miami-Dade County/Broward County line moved south to include the Town of Golden Beach in Broward County. Golden Beach has not been solicited by Broward County to make this request. It is the Town's desire to initiate this action. It is understood that there may be several steps in finalizing this action, including a referendum of the voters of Golden Beach and legislative action by the Florida Legislature.

Section 4. Severability. That the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences and phrases of this Resolution but they shall remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.


Section 5. Conflict. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Effective Date. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Town Council.


