All of these events are open to the public.

In addition to the Town Civic Center, 2020 will also see the Town evaluating our resilience as a coastal community which will include addressing ground saturation and the seasonal flooding we experience and preparing a shore stabilization report for our Ocean Boulevard residents. We will also install the Center Island Pump Station and implement the AIA beautification project.

Civic engagement includes residents taking action together with officials to protect public values and to bring about change or make a difference in a community. Because the goal of civic engagement is to address public concerns and promote the quality of the community, we invite our residents to participate in all of our public meetings. All Town Council meetings are open to the public and myself, the Town Manager and Staff at Town Hall are always available.

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#### Letter from your TOWN MANAGER

ear Residents of Golden Beach,

2020 marks not only the start of a New Year but a new decade. And Golden Beach sets its eyes on the future with an ambitious plan to make our community more innovative and better than ever. Throughout the last 12 years of my tenure as your Town Manager we have never lost focus on making Golden Beach the preeminent place to live. We have tirelessly invested in our infrastructure, increasing property values, and improving quality of life through building recreational programming, all while training our staff and assembling a cohesive plan for what lies ahead.

Our first major step towards modernity comes as we explore our options for a new civic center. The civic center project gained momentum in 2019 and continues to move forward in 2020. The Mayor and Town Council will continue to discuss the project at upcoming Town Council Meetings. A resident-driven committee has been assembled and will assist with assuring the designs meet the specific expectations of those who live in Golden Beach. We are looking to create a new civic center that will serve as a hub for the Town's government but also offer amenities to advance the reputation that Golden Beach holds for being a premiere place to live. Plans include an event space and a Resident gym as well as other facilities to add ease and convenience to residing in Golden Beach. We are also being conscious of spending. The project is a design-to-build, which is a cost-effective solution and will protect the Town from absorbing any additional costs should there be any delays or unexpected changes.

The Town is also being responsible and proactive in our approach to sea level rise and the potential effects it may have on coastal communities. Our focus is to protect your family and your investment. We know that climate change has started to affect our lives in various ways. We have to be ahead of the curve, that's why this year we are doing an inundation study and a sustainability study. The Town is working with state and federal agencies to address access to assistance. We will also continue to meet with Residents to hear your input as to how we can help alleviate localized flooding issues and then enact plans accordingly. We will not tire in our efforts in adapting to climate change.

My administration will continue to make investments to protect property values. Continuing on the path we have followed for the past decade, we will look at ways to reduce our costs so that we can maintain a stable millage rate. Whenever possible we will look to lower the millage rate, an accomplishment we have achieved three times over the course of the past ten years. We will be sure that the one unwavering constant is our top-quality service and dedication to our Residents.

Along with the new civic center project, Golden Beach has several exciting projects to look forward to in the coming year. The Town is also installing a new pump station on Center Island, and we will also undergo an AIA corridor beautification initiative. ## Doggie Day on the Beach

Every dog has his day, as the saying goes, but January 16th was a very special one for our four-legged friends in Town. On that day, Golden Beach held its latest edition of Doggie Day on the Beach, a special event where dogs were allowed to use a designated area of the beach to play and frolic in the surf for a couple of hours.

Don't worry about possibly finding a misplaced chew toy under your towel the next time you're at the Beach Pavilion, the dogs were not allowed access to the main beach area or pavilion. Town staff and police presence were on hand to help ensure safety and compliance among all guests. Check our Calendar in this issue for upcoming pet-friendly fun! If you are considering bringing your dog to an upcoming Doggie Day on the Beach event, please review the Town's list of rules and regulations before heading out.

#### TIPS FOR KEEPING DOGGIE DAY FUN AND SAFE FOR EVERYONE

- 1. Doggie Day takes place only in the designated area. A Golden Beach staff member will inform attendees of what areas are off-limits.
- 2. All dogs must be legally licensed and vaccinated, and shall wear a visible dog license.
- 3. Dogs under 4 months of age and female dogs in heat are prohibited.
- 4. Dogs must be on leash when entering and exiting the off-leash dog area. For health and safety purposes we ask attendees to use the path on the NORTH side of the Beach Pavilion down to the sand to both enter and exit the event. Please do not walk dogs through the Pavilion or the recreational beach area.
- 5. Dogs must be under the control of their handler and in view of their handler at all times.
- 6. Spiked collars are prohibited.
- 7. Children 8 years and under are not allowed in the off-leash dog area; children ages 9 15 years must be accompanied by an adult.
- 8. Handlers must be 16 years of age or older.
- 9. Handler is limited to a maximum of two (2) dogs.
- 10. Handlers must "scoop the poop" and fill any holes dug by dogs under their control.
- 11. Food and drinks in glass containers are prohibited; training treats are allowed.
- 12. Dogs must be removed from the off-leash dog area at the first sign of aggression.
- 13. No animals other than dogs shall be permitted in the area.
- 14. Handlers are responsible for any injuries caused by the dog(s) under their control.
- 15. Participants of Doggie Day do so at their own risk. The Town of Golden Beach shall not be liable for any injury or damage caused by any dog while attending Doggie Day.













# Golden Beach Puts Fitness First

The Town continues to evolve its fitness programming, in 2020 we are launching our "Fitness First" campaign, where we will bring you informative training sessions which will focus on how to take your fitness into your own hands. With topics like strength-training and flexibility, we want to empower and guide you towards your fitness goals. We know your free time is a commodity, so we've broken down the program into four simple sessions throughout the year; that way you can pick and choose which ones best suit your needs. Below is the list of scheduled sessions. Space is limited and we ask Residents RSVP to reserve their spot.

#### FLEXIBILITY - March 11, 2020 - 7:00PM-8:30PM - Tweddle Park

FLEXIBILITY TRAINING: Self-myofascial release techniques, static stretching, active-isolated stretching, and dynamic stretching techniques.

#### STABILIZATION - April 8, 2020 - 7:00PM-8:30PM - Tweddle Park

CORE TRAINING: LPHC including the lumbar spine, the pelvic, abdomen and the hip joint. Training for neuromuscular efficiency, stability and functional strength.

#### STABILIZATION - September 9, 2020 - 7:00PM-8:30PM - Tweddle Park

BALANCE TRAINING: Postural control, maintaining balance, improving reflexive joint stabilization

#### STRENGTH - October 7, 2020 - 7:00PM-8:30PM - Tweddle Park

CARDIO-RESPIRATORY FITNESS TRAINING: Circuit training program consist of series of strength training exercises to perform one after the other with minimal rest. Circuit training as beneficial as traditional forms of cardio-respiratory exercise for improving or contributing to improve fitness levels.

A GBYLG FUNDRAISING PROJECT

The Golden Beach Youth Leadership Group kicked off its latest fundraising effort. Spearheaded by GBYLG member Alana Friedlander the team is selling "Mylk & Cookies." These tasty treats are just like your traditional milk and cookies but all the products are plant-based and have no artificial ingredients. The "mylks" are offered in almond, cashew, and coconut base. The cookies come in chocolate chip and oatmeal raisin variety.

Subscriptions and one-time purchases are available. The delivery will be to your door on a mutually agreed date and time. For subscriptions, a 1-liter bottle of plant-based milk is \$4 and a dozen cookies is \$12. They will be delivered every other week. For one-time purchases, a 1-liter bottle of plant-based milk is \$5 and a dozen cookies is \$14.

Please note, the "mylk" needs to be refrigerated. Since the products do not contain any preservatives, for the best taste consume within 6 days. The recyclable glass bottle will be picked up for minimal waste to the environment.

All profits will go to The Humane League. Their mission is to end the abuse of animals raised for food. They are dedicated to using research for effective animal protection. 
