RESOLUTION NO. 593-90

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL, TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH, FLORIDA REQUESTING THAT THE FLORIDA STATE LEGISLATURE FULLY FUND AND IMPLEMENT PROGRAMS FOR BEACH MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR AS RECOMMENDED BY THE GOVERNOR'S BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, good beaches are an important part of the quality of live of this community, providing enormous esthetic and recreational benefits for our citizens and their guests, and

WHEREAS, good beaches are Florida's number one tourist attraction and are thus vital to the economic well-being of this community, and

WHEREAS, beach erosion continues to be a major problem in this State, threatening this vital natural resource, and

WHEREAS, the 1987 Legislature enacted the comprehensive Beach Management Act to provide a long-term solution to the erosion problem and recommended that the State should spend at least \$35 million annually on beach repair and maintenance, and

WHEREAS, during the past three years no funds have been allocated to prepare and implement the beach management plan, and

WHEREAS, a blue ribbon Task Force appointed by the Governor and Cabinet has recommended that the state commit a minimum of \$70 million each year for beach repair, maintenance and acquisition, and

WHEREAS, the beach funding task force has further proposed that money to implement beach management in Florida be derived from the documentary stamp tax on deeds and notes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Town Council of the Town of Golden Beach urges the Florida Legislature to fully fund and implement the 1987 Florida Beach Management Act, including:

- 1) Adequate appropriation to the Department of Natural Resources to carry out statewide comprehensive beach management planning, and
- Full implementation of the Task Force recommendations to allocate at least \$70 million annually for beach maintenance and repair.
