

GOLDEN BEACH EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 6 <u>HALLOWEEN RESTRICTIONS</u>

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Florida Governor Ron Desantis issued Executive Order 2052 declaring a state of emergency throughout the State due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus ("COVID-19"); and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 Miami-Dade Mayor Carlos Gimenez issued a Declaration of Emergency addressing the outbreak of COVID-19 as a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020 the Mayor of the Town of Golden Beach likewise issued a Declaration of Emergency under the powers afforded to him under the Village Charter, home rule powers and state law; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County has seen a rapid increased spread of COVID-19 throughout the state, particularly in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Golden Beach's Emergency Declaration is still in effect, until such time that the Mayor determines that it is safe to lift it; and

WHEREAS, each of these declarations remain in effect and are in response to COVID-19, which is a highly contagious virus that has and continues to reach unprecedented levels throughout the world, the State of Florida, Miami-Dade County and the Town of Golden Beach; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

That commencing Friday, October 30, 2020 through Monday, November 2, 2020 the following restrictions are in place:

- 1. The Town is closed to any activity that involves going door-to-door.
- 2. The Town is limiting entrance at the Strand to Invited Guest of Residents Only.
- 3. Resident who have not obtained a Special Events Permit will not be allowed to host non-immediate family members at their homes.
- 4. No gatherings of more than 10 people are allowed throughout Town.
- 5. The Beach and Beach Pavilion are open to residents and their accompanied guest; limited.
- 6. The Town will **enforce** a curfew between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., in line with Miami-Dade's countywide curfew.
- 7. **Residents only,** will continue to be allowed to use the Town's 9 designated parks and open spaces between the hours of sunrise and sunset for passive use only.
- 8. Visitors and guests are required to wear a facemask at all times when outside of the home, except when in their backyard.

Effective Date.

This Emergency Executive Order shall become effective on July 8, at 12:00 a.m.
