



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# Golden Beach Responds to COVID-19

The Town has taken active measures to keep you safe. Here are some conditions we have put in place to help flatten the curve of coronavirus. For the latest updates to Town initiatives, please visit www.goldenbeach.us, as some conditions may have changed.

## **Closures:**

Beaches and Parks remain 100% closed

**Town Hall remains closed**, though staff is working remotely on multiple projects

All construction remains 100% closed



# **Visitors:**

Starting Friday morning (4/3/2020) ALL vehicles coming through the substation will be stopped.

NO VISITORS - NO GUESTS will be allowed to enter the Town.

The Town will be open to essential personnel only (house staff, home health staff and caregivers).

## **Deliveries:**

Deliveries are allowed, however only regular deliveries (Uber Eats, Instacart, Amazon, etc.).

Any deliveries that require a large truck are NOT ALLOWED without approval from the Town Manager. Please call The Strand Gatehouse at 305-935-0940 to arrange approval.

# Safety/Security:

Beginning Friday (4/3/2020) A MANDATORY CURFEW is in place from 10:00PM-6:00AM. Only

essential staff and critical response teams are allowed to be on the streets during curfew hours. During curfew, everyone MUST stay home.

**Waterways** are being patrolled day and night as a security measure. The Town would like to remind Residents that all marinas are closed.

Use caution and practice social distancing, even when outdoors, exercising, etc.

# Repairs/Services:

Starting on Friday, April 3, 2020 the following **trades/services will no longer require approval** from the Town Manager. However, companies will need to sign-in at the Gatehouse:

**AC Repairs** 

Pool Maintenance

Pest Control (Exterior Only)

**Appliance Repairs** 

Emergency Repairs Plumbing, Electrical, Telephone, Internet

Landscaping (mowing and blowing only; no clipping, cutting, trimming)

Housekeepers and Caregivers

### The following trades/services are NOT ALLOWED:

Construction of ANY KIND

Maintenance Workers/House Maintenance

Interior Pest Control

Carwashes

Pet Grooming

Yoga, Gym, Fitness Trainers

The following trades/services require approval from the Town Manager before proceeding:

Roof Issues

Any trades/services not mentioned herein require approval

The Town will collect garbage on Mondays and Thursdays.

# DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY FOR THE TOWN OF GOLDEN BEACH

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Honorable Ron Desantis, Governor of the State of Florida, issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency in Florida due to an outbreak of Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS in December 2019, an outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID- 19), was first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China, and has spread outside of China, impacting more than many countries, including the United States; and

WHEREAS the State of Florida has been working in close collaboration with the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), with the United States Health and Human Services Agency, and with local health departments since December 2019 to monitor and plan for the potential spread of COVID-19 to the United States; and

WHEREAS the Town of Golden Beach has been taking protective measures since February 2020 to mitigate effects of COVID-19; and

The Town Council of the Town of Golden Beach, Florida, in accordance with the powers vested in it pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, does hereby proclaim the existence of a state of local emergency in the Town of Golden Beach, Florida.

The Town Manager is authorized to take all actions necessary and appropriate to protect human life and property, including the promulgation of rules and orders as may be necessary subject to the limitations of Section 252.33, Florida Statutes. This proclamation further authorizes the Town Manager to utilize all lawful authority granted to the Town of Golden Beach by Federal, State, County, or Town Emergency Management Laws, Rules, Regulations, Orders and, including, but not limited to, Section 252.46 and Section 252.38(3)(a)(1) through Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, inclusive.

All existing laws, ordinances, and rules inconsistent with the provisions of Sections 252.31 to Section 252.905, Florida Statutes, inclusive, or inconsistent with any rule or order specifically promulgated under this proclamation shall be suspended during this period of time and to the extent that such conflict exists.

# "SAFER AT HOME" EMERGENCY ORDER (Issued on March 23, 2020 at 7 p.m.)

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, I, as Mayor of Golden Beach, promulgated an Emergency Order which, among other requirements, temporarily closed Town facilities and imposed emergency measures effective immediately; and

**WHEREAS,** Miami-Dade County has issued various Emergency Orders temporarily closing public and private facilities, including the temporary closure of all non- essential retail and commercial establishments within Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, numerous counties, municipalities and at least four states have adopted versions of "stay at home" or "safer at home" orders designed to protect the health and well-being of residents, to create social distancing in an effort to limit community spread of COVID-19.

**NOW THEREFORE**, as Mayor of Golden Beach, Florida, and pursuant to the authority vested in me Chapter 252.38(3)(a), Florida Statutes, and Town of Golden Beach Charter Article Section 4.01(b)(6) "Duties and Powers of Mayor", as well as that certain Town of Golden Beach Declaration of State of Emergency, dated March 16, 2020, and in addition to the Emergency Measures I have previously ordered and promulgated, I hereby **ORDER** and **PROMULGATE** the following additional emergency measures, effective **March 24, 2020** at **12:00 a.m.** (the "Order"):

- 1. All persons living within Golden Beach are strongly urged to remain in their homes, subject only to the exceptions outlined in Paragraph 4 below.
- 2. All public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a residence are prohibited, except as to those exempted activities described in this Paragraph and Paragraph 5. This provision does not apply to gatherings within a single household or living unit.
- 3. All travel, including, without limitation, travel on foot, bicycle, scooter, motorcycle, automobile, or use of public transit is prohibited, subject to the exceptions in Paragraph 5.
- 4. All construction activity within the Town has been suspended until further notice.
- 5. **Exceptions.** Notwithstanding the "Safer at Home" directive herein, all residents in the Town may lawfully engage in the following activities:
  - (a) Essential Retail and Commercial Activities. Residents may engage in essential retail and commercial activities, including, without limitation, travel to or from essential retail and commercial businesses, as defined in Miami-Dade County Emergency Order 07-20 (a copy of which is attached hereto), as may be further amended by Miami-Dade County and/or further amended by the Town's Emergency Orders. These essential retail and commercial activities include grocery stores; convenience stores; food distribution centers; restaurants (for take-out and delivery only, and subject to social distance separation of at least 6 feet between patrons); hospitals, pharmacies, and health care providers (including doctor's offices, rehab centers and urgent care centers); gas stations and auto-repair facilities; banks; hardware stores; businesses that provide postal/shipping services and other office products; laundry service providers; childcare facilities providing services to groups of 10 or fewer (subject to limitations in County Emergency Orders); certain professional services; home-based care for seniors, adults or children; pet supply stores, veterinarian and pet boarding facilities; and offices in support of essential retail and commercial activities.

- (b) **Outdoor Recreational Activities.** Residents may engage in outdoor activity and recreation in areas not otherwise closed to the public pursuant to Miami-Dade County Emergency Orders or the Town's Emergency Orders, provided that the individuals maintain a distance of at least six (6) feet between each other, including, without limitation, walking, hiking, running, or cycling.
- (c) **Personal Support Activities.** Residents may travel to and from their homes to care for or support a friend, family member, or pet in another household.
- (d) **Work in Support of Essential Activities.** Residents in the Town may continue to perform work in support of essential activities (e.g., to perform work providing essential products and services or to otherwise carry out activities specifically permitted in this Order or any Order of a City, County, State or Federal governmental entity). Travel by personnel providing essential services to residents within their homes shall be permitted, such as emergency repairs of A/C, electrical, plumbing, cable, telephone and internet, sanitation and exterior extermination, simple landscaping and pool services, home care and home repairs, housekeeping, childcare or other essential services (as provided in Miami- Dade County Emergency Orders, as amended), provided persons engaging in these essential activities shall maintain reasonable social distancing practices and provided residents receive prior approval from the Town Manager.
- (e) **Government Employees and Emergency Personnel.** All first responders, gang and crisis intervention workers, public health workers, emergency management personnel, emergency dispatchers, law enforcement personnel and related contractors, persons working for emergency services providers, and government employees performing work in the course and scope of their employment are categorically exempt from this Order.
- (a) (f) Observance of Social Distancing Practices. As to all activities permitted under this Order, residents and visitors shall adhere to social distancing practices, such as maintaining a distance of at least six (6) feet away from others, washing hands with soap and water for at least twenty seconds or using hand sanitizer, covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands), regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces, and not shaking hands. Residents and visitors are strongly encouraged to limit all of their travel, except as absolutely necessary. Persons at high risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and people who are sick are strongly encouraged to stay in their residence to the extent possible, except as necessary to seek medical care.
- 6. Nothing herein shall limit or apply to any essential governmental, or other operation or activity permitted under any Miami-Dade County Emergency Order or Town of Golden Beach Emergency Order.
- 7. This Order is in addition to, and supplements, the Town's Emergency Orders. All requirements of Town Emergency Orders, Miami-Dade County Emergency Orders, and State of Florida Executive Orders shall be strictly adhered to at all times.

THE EMERGENCY MEASURES THAT HAVE BEEN ORDERED AND PROMULGATED ABOVE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE MARCH 24, 2020 at 12:00 a.m. UNTIL RESCINDED BY THE MAYOR.

## MAYOR'S MESSAGE SPECIAL TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MARCH 26, 2020

I FIRST WANT TO SAY THAT I HOPE ALL OF OUR RESIDENTS, TOWN STAFF, POLICE DEPARTMENT, TOWN ATTORNEY AND FELLOW COUNCILMEMBERS STAY SAFE AND HEALTHY.

THIS IS A SERIOUS CRISIS AND IT EFFECTS EVERYONE, AND UNLESS WE HANDLE THIS CRISIS PROPERLY IT WILL NEVER GO AWAY. EVERYONE MUST START THINKING LONG TERM.

I KNOW THESE ARE TRYING TIMES FOR EVERYONE. RESIDENTS ARE FRUSTRATED, CONCERNED AND NERVOUS. I WANT TO REASURE ALL THE RESIDENTS THAT GOLDEN BEACH IS DOING AND WILL CONTINUE TO DO EVERYHTING TO KEEP OUR RESIDENTS AND EMPLOYEES SAFE AND HEALTHY.

AS MAYOR I HAVE HAD TO MAKE SOME TOUGH DECISIONS WHICH AFFECTS OUR RESIDENTS, BUT I MAKE THESE DECISIONS AFTER DISCUSSING OUR SITUATION WITH STATE, LOCAL AND FEDERAL OFFICIALS. GOLDEN BEACH IS UNIQUE AS WE ARE A SMALL SINGLE-FAMILY COMMUNITY. EVERY TOWN IS DIFFERENT AND IS HANDLING THE SITUATION IN DIFFERENT MANNERS, BUT AS THIS PANDEMIC SPREADS, CHANGES ARE BEING MADE AND WILL CONTINUE TO BE M ADE.

ON MARCH 23, 2020 I ISSUED A SAFER AT HOME EMERGENCY ORDER. THIS ORDER STATES THAT ALL PERSONS LIVING IN GOLDEN BEACH SHOULD REMAIN IN THEIR HOMES. THERE ARE SOME EXCEPTIONS.

I URGE YOU TO READ THE ORDER, WHICH IS ONLINE AND HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO THE COMMUNITY VIA EMAIL AND VOICE MAIL.

A FEW HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS ORDER ARE THE FOLLOWING

- 1) OUR BEACH IS 100 PERCENT CLOSED
- 2) OUR PARKS ARE 100 PERCENT CLOSED
- 3) CONSTRUCTION SITES ARE 100 PERCENT CLOSED
- 4) EMERGENCY REPAIRS MUST GET PRIOR APPROVAL
- 5) MAIDS, HOUSEKEEPERS AND NANNYS ARE ALLOWED, BUT MUST BE SMART AND CAREFUL

I KNOW THERE ARE SEVERAL RESIDENTS IN THE PROCESS OF CONSTRUCTING A NEW HOME. THIS IS A MAJOR INCONVIENCE FOR THESE PEOPLE AND CONTRACTORS. YOU HAVE MY WORD AFTER THIS PANDEMIC PASSES, GOLDEN BEACH WILL DO EVERYTHING WE CAN TO MAKE UP LOST TIME DUE TO THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF THESE SITES.

IT'S GREAT SEEING MANY OF OUR RESIDNETS OUT WALKING, RUNNING AND BIKING DURING THE DAY, BUT PLEASE DO NOT CONGREGATE AND KEEP AT LEAST 6 FEET APART FROM EACH OTHER.

THIS IS AN EMERGENCY ORDER AND MUST BE TAKEN SERIOUSLY, AS EVERY DAY THERE ARE MORE AND MORE CASES OF THE VIRUS AND THE DEATH TOLL IS CLIMBING RAPIDLY.

SOUTH FLORIDA IS ONE OF THE MOST RAPIDLY INFECTED GROWTH AREAS IN THE COUNTRY.

I AM LOOKING OUT FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILIES BY ISSUING THE TOWN'S EMERGENCY ORDER.

THE TOWN MANAGER AND I ARE IN CONSTANT COMMUNICATION WITH LOCAL AND STATE AND FEDERAL OFFICIALS GETTING CONSTANT UPDATES.

I WANT TO THANK OUR TOWN MANAGER ALEX DIAZ, OUR POLICE CHIEF RUDY HERBELLO AND HIS COMMAND STAFF, AND OUR GOLDEN BEACH POLICE OFFICERS WHO ARE DOING AN AMAZING JOB DURRING THIS STRESSFUL SITUATION. I ASK YOU NEXT TIME YOU ARE WALKING OR RUNNING OR RIDING IN TOWN PLEASE STOP AND WAVE AND THANK OUR GOLDEN BEACH POLICE OFFICERS TO SHOW OUR APPRECIATION AND GRADITUDE.

WE WILL GET THROUGH THIS, BUT WE ALL HAVE TO MAKE SACRIFICES TODAY FOR THERE TO BE A BETTER TOMORROW.

WE CAN'T AFFORD TO BE SELFISH AND ONLY THINK OF OURSELVES. WE MUST THINK OF OUR NEIGHBORS, OUR TOWN STAFF, OUR POLICE OFFICERS, OUR FAMILIES, AND OUR CHILDREN.

SO PLEASE UNDERSTAND AND COMPLY AND WORK WITH US. THANK YOU AND STAY HEALTHY.

# GOLDEN BEACH EXECUTIVE ORDER EXTENDING "SAFER AT HOME" EMERGENCY ORDER (Issued on April 2, 2020 at 12 p.m.)

**WHEREAS,** on March 23, 2020, I, as Mayor of Golden Beach, promulgated a "safer at home" Emergency Order designed to protect the health and well-being of residents, to create social distancing in an effort to limit community spread of COVID-19.

**WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2020 Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order No. 20-91 outlining the essential services and activities during the COVID-19 Emergency to include a statewide safer-at-home order and the closure of all non-essential businesses through April, 30, 2020.

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020 Miami-Dade County issued an order extending the local state of emergency.

WHEREAS, numerous counties, municipalities and at least four states have extended their "stay at home" or "safer at home" orders to protect the health and well-being of residents, to create social distancing in an effort to limit community spread of COVID-19.

**NOW THEREFORE**, as Mayor of Golden Beach, Florida, and pursuant to the authority vested in me Chapter 252.38(3)(a), Florida Statutes, and Town of Golden Beach Charter Article Section 4.01(b)(6) "Duties and Powers of Mayor", as well as that certain Town of Golden Beach Declaration of State of Emergency, dated March 16, 2020, and in addition to the Emergency Measures I have previously ordered and promulgated, I hereby **ORDER** and **PROMULGATE** the following additional emergency measures, effective **April 3, 2020** at **12:00 a.m.** (the "Order"):

- 1. All persons living within Golden Beach are strongly urged to remain in their homes, subject only to the exceptions outlined in Paragraph 10 below.

  In addition, no visitors or guests will be allowed in Golden Beach until further notice.
- 2. A mandatory curfew between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. will immediately go into effect. Only essential personnel will be allowed on the streets during the curfew.
- 3. All public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a residence are prohibited, except as to those exempted activities described in Paragraph 10. This provision does not apply to gatherings within a single household or living unit (i.e. individuals living in the same household).
- 4.All travel, including, without limitation, travel on foot, bicycle, scooter, motorcycle, automobile, or use of public transit is prohibited, subject to the exceptions in Paragraph 10.
- 5. All construction activity within the Town has been suspended until further notice.
- 6. No mobile pet grooming services or mobile car wash services will be permitted until further notice.
- 7. Property managers and home maintenance workers are not allowed to be in town until further notice.

- 8. No interior pest control of any kind until further notice.
- 9. No yoga, gym, or fitness instructors are allowed in Golden Beach or in your private residence during this time.
- 10. **Exceptions**. Notwithstanding the "Safer at Home" directive herein, all residents in the Town may lawfully engage in the following activities:
  - (a) **Essential Retail and Commercial Activities.** The following retail and commercial activities are allowed:
    - Trips to grocery stores; convenience stores; food distribution centers; restaurants (for take-out and delivery only, and subject to social distance separation of at least 6 feet between patrons); hospitals, pharmacies, and health care providers (including doctor's offices, rehab centers and urgent care centers); gas stations; banks; childcare facilities providing services to groups of 10 or fewer (subject to limitations in County Emergency Orders); certain professional services; and home-based care for seniors, adults or children.
  - (b) **Outdoor Recreational Activities**. Residents may engage in outdoor activity and recreation in areas not otherwise closed to the public pursuant to Miami-Dade County Emergency Orders or the Town's Emergency Orders, provided that the individuals maintain a distance of at least six (6) feet between each other, including, without limitation, walking, hiking, running, or cycling.

As a reminder all of the Town's parks, beaches and shorelines are closed.

- (c) **Personal Support Activities.** Residents may travel to and from their homes to care for or support a friend, family member, or pet in another household.
- (d) **Work in Support of Essential Activities.** Residents in the Town may continue to receive the following essential services within their homes:
  - A/C repairs, sanitation and exterior extermination, appliance repairs, emergency repairs of plumbing, electrical, telephone and internet, simple landscaping (mowing and blowing only) and pool services, home care and home repairs, housekeeping, childcare or other essential services, provided persons engaging in these essential activities shall maintain reasonable social distancing practices. **Anything not listed above requires prior approval from the Town Manager.**
- (e) **Government Employees and Emergency Personnel.** Only essential personnel such as law enforcement employees will work in Town. All other non-essential staff will telework until further notice. Public Works crews will continue to work collecting garbage on Mondays and Thursdays and will provide limited clean-up services as directed by the Town Manager.
- (f) Observance of Social Distancing Practices. As to all activities permitted under this Order, residents and visitors shall adhere to social distancing practices, such as maintaining a distance of at least six (6) feet away from others, washing hands with soap and water for at least twenty seconds or using hand sanitizer, covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands), regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces, and not shaking hands. Residents and visitors are strongly encouraged to limit all of their travel, except as absolutely necessary. Persons at high risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and people who are sick are strongly encouraged to stay in their residence to the extent possible, except as necessary to seek medical care.

11. Nothing herein shall limit or apply to any essential governmental, or other operation or activity permitted under any Miami-Dade County Emergency Order or Town of Golden Beach Emergency Order.

12. This Order is in addition to, and supplements, the Town's Emergency Orders. All requirements of Town Emergency Orders, Miami-Dade County Emergency Orders, and State of Florida Executive Orders shall be strictly adhered to at all times.

THE EMERGENCY MEASURES THAT HAVE BEEN ORDERED AND PROMULGATED ABOVE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE APRIL 3, 2020 at 12:00 a.m. UNTIL RESCINDED BY THE MAYOR.

# COVID-19 PROTECTION, PLANNING & CARE FOR OLDER ADULTS

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, older adults may have a greater chance for serious illness from COVID-19—especially people with weak immune systems or underlying chronic medical conditions like heart, lung, diabetes or kidney disease.

- **Symptoms include:** fever, coughing, and shortness of breath. **If you develop symptoms,** stay home and call your health care provider. You may be able to recover at home.
- You need emergency help if symptoms become more severe, there is chronic chest pain, breathing is difficult or your lips turn bluish.



### Protection

**Wash your hands** often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Wash after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing, Wash after spending time in a public place. Wash before and after touching people you're caring for. If soap and water aren't available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

**Cover your coughs and sneezes.** Use a tissue or your sleeve when coughing.

### **Practice Social Distancing:**

- Avoid crowds and large gatherings, especially in venues with poor ventilation.
- Don't shake hands with people.
- Keep at least 6 feet between you and other people.
- Stay away from people who may be sick.
- Try shopping during off-hours—later on weeknights or earlier on weekends—when crowds at stores are lower.
- Avoid touching "high-touch" surfaces: elevator buttons, door handles, handrails, etc.
- Find out if family or friends have been sick in the past two weeks BEFORE they visit. If they have been sick, reschedule at least two weeks out.

### **Planning**

Get a flu shot if you are showing no symptoms of illness.

**If you depend on regular medical treatment** like dialysis, wound care, etc., talk to your health care provider about special arrangements.

**Create a contact list** of family, friends, neighbors, health care providers, community assistance programs and drivers. Make sure phone numbers are up-to-date.

**Stay in touch** with the people on your list and let them know you may need them for help if you become sick.



### Have a two-three week supply of the following:

- Non-perishable food
- Medical and health care supplies
- Prescriptions: make sure they are up-to-date



#### Care

## Caregivers, help prevent the spread of COVID-19. If the person you're caring for lives in a facility:

- Know the facility's outbreak protocol.
- Ask daily about the health of the other residents.
- Monitor visitors. Ask if they've been ill over the past two weeks or if they currently have a fever. A "yes" answer means the visit needs to be postponed for at least two weeks.

**If you're caring for someone at home,** you'll need to prepare a separate bedroom and bathroom for them. Learn more about this type of at-home care: CDC.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/hcp/guidance-prevent-spread.html




# DON'T LITTER: STOP DISCARDING YOUR GLOVES AND MASKS IN THE STREET.


